### RUNAWAY ACCIDENT.

**P. T. Orlopp Receives Injuries  
From Fractious Horse.**

P. T. Orlopp, assistant engineer on the filtering plant, is congratulating himself over his escape from death last Saturday morning. As it is, he is suffering from bruises and contusions that make the accident still very realistic for him. He, with his brother and another man, had started from the filtering plant to town, driving a fractious bronco, when suddenly the animal landed a blow from his heel on Orlopp's knee. The force of the blow and his endeavors to get out of range caused Orlopp to tumble out backwards, and unfortunately he lit on his face and shoulder, his head striking a large rock, and cutting a gash just back of his right ear, besides badly lacerating that member. The wound required four stitches to close, and Orlopp has been busy applying liniment and soothing preparations to the numerous bruised places on his body. His brother and Mr. Townsend both jumped from the buggy when the animal started to run, and luckily each escaped without a scratch, although the lad was rolled in the dirt for a considerable distance.

### GOOD ROADS TRAIN.

**In Brady Next Tuesday, June 3rd.**

On March 25, 1912, a unique train departed from Brownsville, Texas, for a four months trip over the Frisco system. This will be the Good Roads Special to be operated by the Frisco Railway Co., the office of Public Roads of the U. S. Department of Agriculture and the American Association for Highway Improvement. It will be a train of four cars, specially equipped, and will carry lecturers and an unusual exhibit. This exhibit consists of carefully prepared models of all types of road construction from sand-clay and gravel to bituminous macadam, and of re-inforced concrete bridges and culverts, completed and under construction. It also contains miniature models of road machinery and a rock quarry which are operated by electricity. Each model in the car is properly labeled so that the object lesson in itself affords a considerable road education. The equipment of this train even surpasses that of the four similar good roads trains recently operated over other railway systems of the United States.

This train will cover about 15,000 miles in the states of Texas, Louisiana, Missouri, Kansas, Arkansas, Oklahoma, Mississippi and Alabama. A complete schedule of stops has been prepared which provides opportunity for more than three hundred lectures upon good roads topics. These lectures will be given upon those road subjects which are most intimately connected with the locality visited.

Mr. H. C. Wells, superintendent of road construction, assisted by Mr. J. W. Janssen, both of the U. S. office of Public Roads, will accompany the train to give good roads lectures. Their addresses will be illustrated by over one hundred colored lantern slides. The representatives of the American Association for Highway Improvement will effect good roads organizations where there is a desire to have them. These men are expert highway engineers and are prepared and willing to answer all questions which time permits at each stop.

This train is scheduled to arrive at Brady, Texas, on June 3rd, 1912. Should the audience prove greater than can be accommodated in the lecture car, provision will be made to deliver the lectures at some hall. Meeting will be held at Brady June 3 at 2:00 p. m.

### OIL NEWS.

**Hapenings in the Oil Field  
Gathered at Random.**

Messrs. Egan and Kisskaddon, who have been fishing the past couple of weeks for a broken bit in the deep well at Lohn, Monday abandoned the well and started a new hole, having found it impossible to get the bit out.

J. O. Martin, manager of the Big Four Oil Co., has received his deep well machinery and is this week having it hauled out to Lohn. He will erect the rig on the Roberts tract, one mile east of the location of the big well on the Meers tract, and will go to drilling just as soon as the machinery is in readiness. Mr. Martin has another deep well rig on the road, and is expecting it in some time next week.

Dr. Jones is down about 430 feet with his well, and still drilling.

J. A. Copeland, who is drilling on the Foster tract, one and a half miles east of Lohn, is experiencing no trouble so far, and the work is progressing steadily. Moore Bros. are doing the drilling. The company represented by Mr. Copeland will have a rotary drill shipped in in the near future with which they will continue the well started on the Waddle tract.

The production of the shallow wells on the Meers tract is holding up satisfactorily. Well No. 2, after being pumped continuously day and night for a month, produces practically no water at all, and the oil production has been materially increased.

### BIG RANCH DEAL.

**M. B. McKnight and Frank  
Douglas Trade Ranches.**

A deal was closed Friday between Frank Douglas and M. B. McKnight whereby the two traded ranches and stock. The Douglas ranch is composed of five sections of land and valued at \$10 per acre and lies sixteen miles northeast of Eldorado. The McKnight ranch consists of three and one-half sections valued at \$7.50 and is two miles northeast of Eldorado. Mr. McKnight also put in his home in Eldorado at \$2,500. In the deal McKnight buys the Douglas cattle, paying \$30 for grown cows and \$22 for heifers and steer yearlings. This includes some Black Poll cattle. Mr. Douglas buys the McKnight cattle, also the lease on the J. E. Jones ranch. This is one of the largest ranch deals that has been made here for some time. —Eldorado Success.

### Rochelle School Closes.

The closing of the Rochelle school was marked by impressive commencement exercises on Monday night in the presence of an immense throng of patrons and well-wishers. In the graduating class were eight young men and young ladies, and the remarkable feature was that of the eight, six were boys. Their orations were deep, carefully prepared, and showed the training which they have received at the hands of their teachers. The stage was beautifully decorated for the occasion and the entire program for the evening came in for liberal praise at the hands of all who attended.

The class and the visitors had the pleasure of listening to two splendid addresses, one by Hon. Will H. Mayes of Brownwood, the other by Judge Harvey Walker. The baccalaureate sermon was preached Sunday morning at 11 o'clock by Rev. D. R. Hardison, and was in itself a masterpiece that impressed itself deeply upon the minds and hearts of the audience.

McCulloch county is harvesting her oats, and so great is the yield in Matchless McCulloch that the binders were kept running all day Sunday in more than one section. McCulloch has no edge on Menard county, however, for the oat crop is especially prolific over there. However the only kind sowed by the wicked citizens over there is wild oats, which accounts for our oat crop being so superior, if not any larger, than that of Menard.

Reports from places that have been infested by grasshoppers the past week, are to the effect that the pest is diminishing rapidly. The farmers have fenced against them, and likewise trapped and burned them in great numbers, with the result that the number is dwindling day by day. The fight has been kept up without cessation, continuing all day Sunday. The best tidings from the district is that the crops were not so greatly damaged as was at first anticipated, and while inroads were made into some fields of cotton, the damage was not so great as thought.

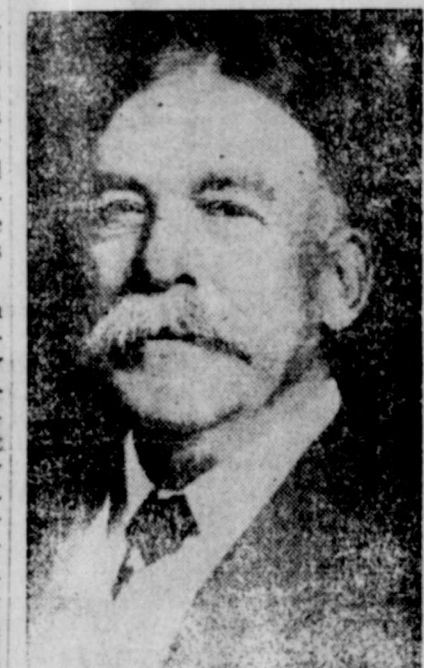

### WANTS R. R. REFORMS.

President of Santa Fe Addresses Welfare Commission.



Fort Worth, Texas, May 24.—Mr. E. P. Ripley, president of the Santa Fe railway system appeared before the Welfare Commission in this city Tuesday and gave his views on the railroad situation of Texas from a practical standpoint.

In a plain, straightforward manner and with a frankness peculiarly his own, the noted railroad man pointed out the difficulties that confronted the growth and progress of the railroad industry in Texas.

Mr. Ripley contended that railroads should be permitted to issue securities to the full value of their property and should be allowed to issue bonds for improvement purposes; that railroad investments were not bringing a fair return; that the tax value was greater than the earning value; that personal injury and damage payments in Texas were far in excess of those of other states and suggested that the railroad commission should be removed as far as possible from political influence.

The next session of the Welfare Commission will be held in San Antonio on Monday, June 10th, and those who desire to defend the present laws as relate to railroads are urged to be present, as the commission is anxious to hear all sides of the question.
