**BRADY-ROBERT LEE R. R.**

**NEW PROJECT — HOUSTON PARTIES PROMOTERS.**

Line of Road to be Built From Robert Lee to Brady—Surveyors Ready for Work.

T. J. Webb, whose ranch is on the Colorado river about twenty-five miles above Ballinger, was in Ballinger Friday, and is our authority for a railroad story that may be brought to the attention of the people in the near future. Mr. Webb told the writer that surveyors were in the Robert Lee and Bronte country, and would probably be in Ballinger in a few days. He said he learned through one of the surveyors that Houston parties were promoting a line of road to be built from Robert Lee to Brady, and that he traveled on the train from San Angelo to Bronte with one of the surveyors and was informed by the surveyor that his business was to look out a route for a road leading out from Bronte down the Colorado river on the north side to Ballinger and from Ballinger to Brady. Further than this no statement was made by the surveyor.

A proposition was made to Robert Lee some time ago to build a road from Bronte to that town, and the people of Robert Lee were asked to raise a bonus. They are doing this and feel sure they will be connected with the world by steel at an

**RABBIT DRIVE.**

**Cow Gap Folks Kill 81 of Pests Thursday.**  
H. L. Winstead yesterday reported the first rabbit drive of the season in the Cow Gap community, and the day's drive netted the party 81 scalps. Although forty men and boys were expected to take part but seventeen showed up on the scene, and Mr. Winstead is confident that had all come the result would have been between two and three hundred rabbit scalps. He stated that they will have another drive in the near future, at which time it is hoped to have all the men and boys in that community out, and they expect to make a cleanup on the rabbits which are quite numerous throughout that section.  
Rabbit drives are becoming a popular form of sport, not only in this county, but in neighboring counties as well, and are about the only real means of affording relief from the destructive pests. Now that the commissioners have renewed the rabbit bounty, the drives should

become all the more popular, as the bounty will help pay for the ammunition used.

The railroads of the Southeastern Passenger Association have made a thirty day rate of one cent a mile. The War Department has loaned the requisite number of tents and cots in order that Chattanooga may suitably care for the 15,000 veterans who are expected to attend, and who will be lodged and fed free of all cost.

The United Sons of Veterans will hold their reunion at the same place, May 27-29. They will bring with them the usual bevy of beautiful Southern women as sponsors and maids of honor and chaperones, all of whom will be lavishly entertained by the citizens of Chattanooga.
