PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO THE STATE CONSTITUTION PRE-SCRIBING QUALIFICATIONS FOR DISTRICT JUDGES OF THIS STATE AND PRESCRIB-ING THEIR TENURE OF OF-

(S. J. R. No. 1.) A Joint Resolution. Amending Section 7, Article 5, of the Constitution of the State of Texas, relating to the creation and formaof compensation and qualification of the judges of the district courts,

as follows: Section 7. The State shall be divided into as many judicial districts as may now or hereafter be provided by law, which may be increased or diminished by law. For each dis-trict there shall be elected by the qualified voters thereof, at a general election, one or more judges, each of whom shall be a citizen of the United States and of this State, who shall have been a practicing lawyer of this State, or a judge of a court in this State for six years next preceding his election; who shall have resided in the district in which he was elected for two years next preceding his election; who shall reside in his district during his term of office; who shall hold his office for a period of shall hold his office for a period of four years, and shall receive for his services an annual salary of three thousand dollars, until otherwise changed by law. Court shall be held by a district judge at the county seat in each of the several counties at such times and in such manner as may be prescribed by law. 

AN ORDINANCE.

Requiring Railroads to Place Lights on Street Crossings. Be it ordained by the city council of the city of Brady: That hereafter all railway companies operating trains on or across any public street within the corporate limits of said city at night, shall, when requested so to do by the city council, keep suspended on some suitable device to be approved by said council on each side of such streets at each crossing of their track a light each of not less than 100 watt consumption per hour, to be lighted and kept lighted and in good order during all hours of the night.

Any railway company who shall operate or be concerned in operating any train of cars within the corporate limits of this city in violation of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction therefor, shall be fined in any sum not exceeding one hundred dollars, and each and every night that the above ordinance is violated shall constitute a separate offense.
