The First Cable, The laying down of the first intercontinental cable was begun in 1857. The vessels two American and two

British, laid 300 miles of the cable, when it snapped, and the attempt was put off until 1858. In August of that year the junction between the two continents was completed by the laying down of 2,050 miles of cable from Valentia, Ireland, to Newfoundland. The engineer was Sir Charles Bright, who was knighted for his success. The first two messages were sent on August 5, and were from the queen of England to the president of the United States and his reply. But after sending 271 messages the cable proved a failure, and a perfect one was not secured until 1866.
