The club has a proposition from Mrs L. Adrian, who established such a line from Menard to Junction several months ago, but later abandoned the project on account of unfavorable road conditions, the rough roads causing the upkeep on the cars to mount so high as to leave the margin of profit entirely tos small to make the line pay a just return on the investment. In the proposition now before the local commercial organization it is proposed that Brady and Masen improve the road to the line of each county and maintain it in first-class ecndition, and if this is done the establishment of the line is an assured fact. <br> It is stated that the road is in good shape for about ten miles out of Brady, and that it would not cost very much to place the balance of the road in this county in a fairly good state of repair. The Mason people are anxious for the line, and have | pledged themselves to comply with any reasonable requests made of them in the matter. <br> For the present it is proposed to operate the line only to Mason, but later on will be extended as far south as Fredericksburg, and the promotors state that they are ready to begin the operation of the line to Mason just as soon as the equipment can be gotten in here. A regular schedule will be maintained, and the line will handle express and perishable freight shipments and passengers. <br> Other matters receiving attention at the meeting was that of better fire protection in the residence portion of the city, the club having appointed a committee at a recent meeting to investigate and report on the matter.
