serve bank organization committee in Washington, D. C., announced the
twelve banking districts and the twelve cities where Federal Reserve Banks
are to be located.

posed of the following states: All of Texas, Western Louisiana, Southern
New Mexico. Southern Oklahoma and five counties in Southern Arizona.
