Mr. Leddy further boasts of having had the heaviest oats in McCulloch county last year, the net weight being 34 pounds to the bushel. Wiley Walker of the Waldrip community probably ranks second, with oats that weighed 31 pounds to the bush-

This year Mr. Leddy says his oats will run from 33 to 34 pounds to the bushel, but the production was light on account of his having used his thinnest land for the oats in order that he might again plant peas on the stubble. By this method, Mr. Leddy will not only get a profitable crop of peas, but the peas will help build up the thin land.

Corn is fairly good in his section, and had the rain come just a few days earlier, would have been fine.

\$50,000 BROWNWOOD FIRE.

Waples-Platter Grocery-Stock a Total Loss.

Fire of an unknown origin, discovered at a few minutes before 11 o'clock last night, destroyed the Waples-Platter Wholesale Grocery Company's stock of merchandise, causing a loss of approximately \$50,000, fully covered by insurance. large building on Main avenue near the Frisco railroad was completely gutted, only the tone walls remaining standing.

When first discovered the fire appeared to be about the center of the large building. Great clouds of smoke were pouring from the house, making it impossible to locate the seat of the fire and seriously handicapping the fire fighters in their work. The building itself made fire fighting very difficult, since the only openings along the sides of the house are small windows placed high up and covered with heavy screen wire.

The volunteer firemen experienced many difficulties in fighting the flames. The driver of the first wagon that reached the scene found the smoke so dense in the street in front of the building that it was necessary to use a lantern in order to see his way through the street. 




