STOWE DEAD. <br> Asphyxiated in His Room in Austin Last Night. <br> A telephone message to Joe Lyle this morning at 2 o'clock conveyed the information that his brother-in-law, Chas. A. Stowe, had been asphyxiated by gas in his room at a rooming house. The message came from Mrs. Stowe, who had just been informed of the tragedy.
