IS SHOT BY PROWLER

CHAS. HILL SEVERELY IN-JURED LAST NIGHT.

Finds Intruder in House and Receives Bullet Wounds in Driving Man Out.

Considerable excitement was occasioned in Brady about 4:00 o'clock this morning over the report of the shooting of Chas. Hill at his home in the Waldrip community. The message was delivered to Sheriff Wall and also to D. W. Hill, Jr., brother the injured man, and who was spending the night in town, by phone. Sheriff Wall, accompanied by Judge Harvey Walker and Mr. Hill, left this morning for Waldrip to investigate the occurrence.

Details are very meagre, about the only information so far had in Brady being that Mr. Hill found a masked man in his home about 2:30 this morning, house, was shot by the intruder. The nature and the severity of the wounds was not stated, although it is surmised that the injured man's condition is serious, since two physicians






