**SOUTHWEST TRAIL.**

Chicago to the Gulf Highway Routed via Brady.

T. P. Grant was yesterday in receipt of a telegram from D. E. Colp, secretary of the Texas Good Roads association, stating the Southwest Trail had been routed via Wichita Falls, Coleman and Brady to San Antonio. Mr. Grant last week logged this highway from Brady up to Wichita Falls, and then wired the results of the logging to Mr. Colp at the Wichita, Kan., meeting. At this meeting the main route of the Meridian highway was retained via Fort Worth and Waco to the coast, although strong representations were made to have it changed to traverse East Texas. Brady, Coleman and Wichita Falls promptly "tied on" to the highway, and thus completed what is known as the Southwest Trail, running from Chicago via Wichita Kan., and Wichita Falls, Texas, to the gulf. Secretary Colp secured recognition of this highway at the Kansas meeting.

Mr. Grant says he never saw a liver bunch of good roads enthusiasts than along the route from Coleman to Wichita Falls. County commissioners, county officials and citizens all along the route joined in the logging trip and boosted for good roads all along the proposed route, and several of the more enthusiastic were highly in favor of continuing the trip all the way to Wichita, Kan.

**BOOSTERS TO BURNET.**

Twenty Autos to Carry Delegates to Roads Meeting.

Brady good roads boosters will leave in a body for Burnet, Texas, where an effort will be made to have the Great Plains highway routed from Austin, Burnet, Llano via Brady to San Angelo. The delegation will leave at 3:00 o'clock sharp this afternoon, and the meeting is scheduled at Burnet for tomorrow noon. There will be a great meeting of good roads boosters, parties coming up from Austin for the meeting, and from all intermediate points. It is likewise anticipated that Mason, Menard and other points will also have large delegations on hand in an effort to route the highway via Mason and Menard to San Angelo. Brady, however, will make strong representations, and it appears without question that the route will be made permanent via Brady.

A strong fight, at any rate, is to be made by Brady, and in this she will be assisted by San Saba, Melvin and other interested points.

Following a meeting of the Y. M. B. L. yesterday a large number of citizens volunteered to accompany the delegation and Melvin and other points were also communicated with, and are sure to join in the movement.

**Mrs. Gil Simpson Dead.**

News of the death of Mrs. Ollie Simpson, wife of Gil Simpson, at Eldorado at 4:00 o'clock Sunday afternoon, October 8th, brought sadness to many Brady hearts, Mrs. Simpson having resided here for several years, and being known and admired by a large circle of friends.

The body was carried to the home of the sister of the deceased, Mrs. S. W. Espy, and funeral services were held yesterday afternoon at 4:00 o'clock at the grave, Rev. R. M. Bailey, assisted by Rev. I. T. Morris, conducting. Interment was made in Brady cemetery.

Mrs. Simpson was born in 1870 near Goliad, Texas, her maiden name having been Miss Ollie McGrew. She was married December 20, 1898, to Mr. Gil Simpson. For several years they made their home about 12 miles this side of Junction, where Mr. Simpson was engaged in the mercantile business. Following the failing of Mrs. Simpson's health he disposed of his business and removed to New Mexico. On account of the altitude being too high the family returned only about a week ago, and took up their residence in Eldorado, where Mrs. Simpson succumbed to the dread disease, tuberculosis.

Besides her husband, deceased is survived by three children—two boys, John Gilbert and Jim, and one girl, Dixie. Her mother, Mrs. Alice McGrew, and two sisters, Mrs. Sid Espy of this city and Mrs. Sam Jones, of Eldorado, also survive, and to the bereaved ones is extended the sympathy of the entire community.
