PHYSICIANS HOLD MEETING

Annual Convention in Progress in Brady--Many Prominent M. D.'s on Program.

The Fourth District Medical association convened this morning in the district court room of the court house for a two-days' professional meeting, at which subjects treating on diseases of the human body are to be discussed by some of the most learned physicians in Texas. Dr. J. S. Anderson of Brady, president of the association, is in charge of the meeting. Dr. R. H. Cochran of Coleman is secretary-treasurer and Dr. S. C. Parsons of San Angelo is councillor. Dr. Parsons was one of the first arrivals, coming here yesterday evening, while the majority of the visitors came this morning.

Preparations for the entertainment of the distinguished visitors have been completed by the local physicians, aided by the business men of Brady, and every effort will be put forth to make their visit a most pleasant and memorable one. This afternoon the visiting ladies will be tendered a reception at the home of Mrs. J. G. McCall by Meses. McCall, J. S. Anderson, J. B. Granville and G. P. Callan. Tonight a banquet will be tendered the visitors by the ladies of the Presbyterian church in the building adjoining The Standard office. Tomorrow afternoon an auto ride over the city will be another social feature.

Last night at the Methodist tabernacle Dr. J. B. McKnight, superintendent of the State Tubercular Sanatorium at Carlsbad, had charge of the open meeting, at which the subject of "Tuberculosis" was lectured upon by Dr. S. E. Thomson, assistant superintendent of the sanatorium at Carlsbad. A small but interested audience of citizens was in attendance. Dr. S.

C. Parsons of San Angelo, councillor of the Fourth District Medical association, made a preliminary talk in which he expressed regret that the public took so little interest in a matter of so vital importance. He expressed the hope that by the time the association met in Brady again the public would be so alive to the importance of cooperating in every way with the physicians that the tabernacle would not accommodate one-third of the crowd on hand to hear the lectures.

Dr. S. E. Thomson was then introduced, and held his audience spellbound by his portrayal of the subject, beginning with the earliest known references, hundreds of years before Christ, to the subject, on down to the present time. He stated that many years ago the term consumption was used, and was a literal expression of the disease then known—a disease which actually consumed its victims. The hectic flush of the cheek, the brightness of the eye, the cough, the expectoration, the stooped shoulders all indicated the disease, which was pronounced incurable. Little by little, the physicians learned more and more about the disease, until only in recent years it was found that instead of an abnormal growth upon the organs, the disease came from a microbe. Then it became known that the disease, in its incipient stage, could be successfully combated. Today, according to Dr. Thomson, it is a disgrace to a community, to the citizens and to the physicians for a case of advanced tuberculosis to be permitted. The responsibility for stamping out this curse rests upon three

shoulders—a wise government, an intelligent body of physicians and an enlightened public. Dr. Thomson stated a well man is a well man. If a man is not well; if he suffers from indigestion, if his work tires him, if he loses his mental activity, the chances are that man has an incipient case of tuberculosis. To allow the disease in this stage to be neglected and become advanced is criminal.

Dr. McKnight closed the meeting with a brief statement of the sanatorium at Carlsbad, stating that at present they could accommodate 100 patients; an annex now practically completed will take care of 40 more, and still another annex now being constructed another 40. He stat-

ed that only incipient cases of tuberculosis were taken for treatment, and on account of the limited accommodations only a very few of these. The patients were lectured once every week upon the care and prevention of the disease, and at the end of six months were sent back to their home community to give other sufferers the benefit of the knowledge gained at the sanatorium. By this method the state hoped to make knowledge of the care and treatment of the disease so universal that the younger generation might live to see it stamped out entirely. Dr. McKnight closed the meeting by extending a cordial invitation to the public to attend

MODERN PHONESYSTEM

TO BE INSTALLED IN BRADY IMMEDIATELY.

Manager F. W. Greber Makes Announcement of Improvement—Material Here Soon.

F. W. Greber of Brownwood, general manager of the West Texas Telephone Co., has given out an interview in which he announces the installation in Brady in the immediate future of one of the most complete and modern telephone systems in West Texas. The new system will be what is known as the flash-light system, and will entirely replace the present magnetic phone system. The present equipment will be discarded almost in its entirety, a new switchboard being installed and modern telephone instruments replacing the old ones. The cost of the contemplated improvements will be approximately \$13,500.

According to Mr. Greber, material for the new exchange will begin arriving in Brady the latter part of this month, and installation will be commenced about December 1st. The West Texas Telephone Co. has leased the second story of the new Masonic temple for a period of ten years, and the new system is to be installed in the new quarters. The floor space is 32x100 feet, which will give ample space for all present and future needs of the company, and the fire-proof construction of the building will warrant the West Texas Telephone people in installing the very best of equipment. In addition to the telephone equipment, the offices of the company will be elegantly furnished, every comfort and convenience being well looked after.
