Considerable solicitation has been occasioned by our account of difficulties experienced last week with The Standard's lino type machine, and we are happy to state that it is once more in apple-pie order.

While we had engaged the services of an expert to come and rectify the trouble, The Stand ard's own expert machinist, Ed the trouble in time for us to no tify the expert of the fact before he commenced his trip here.

Just what the trouble was is hard to state definitely. A speck of dust, a hair from a brush used in cleaning out the magazine, a bit of corrosion or a weak spring -one or all of these may have been the cause of our difficul ties. Suffice to say that after four or five days of strenuous and nerveracking endeavor, during which time the machine was virtually dismantled and set up anew, Mr. Clark succeeded in
