ANOTHER NEW BLOCK.

W. H. Gibbons Has Plans Drawn for Business Building.

The architect's drawing of a modern business building for W. H. Gibbons is now on display at the Jones Drug Co., and is the subject of much favorable and commendatory notice. The new building is designed to occupy the business site on the east side of the square, owned by Mr. Gibbons, and will replace the old Klondike building and the restaurant building and the Demp tailor shop adjoining.

W. H. Cameron, San Antonio architect, and who designed the Masonic building and who also drew up the plans for the new Methodist church building, drew the plans for the proposed new building. The structure, as designed, will have a frontage of 50 feet, with 90 ft. depth, and will be of two-story height. It will be of modern, concrete construction, thoroughly fire-proof, and will have an ornamental facing of pressed brick. The first floor will be designed for business purposes, and will have a solid plate glass front and plate glass on the north side extending the depth of the show windows. The second floor is designed for modern office rooms.

While Mr. Gibbons has not fully decided upon the acceptance of the plans, it is reasonably certain that he will commence the improvement of the property in a very short time. The site is one of the best, as well as one of the most centrally located in town, and the present structures, in addition to being unsightly, are a menace to the business section because of the inflammable material composing their construction. Mr. Gibbons is at present in El Paso seeing after the splendid new business block being constructed in that city for him, and upon his return here will, no doubt, decide definitely as to the plans for the new building, which, we can assure our readers, will be a credit to himself and to the town of Brady as well.
