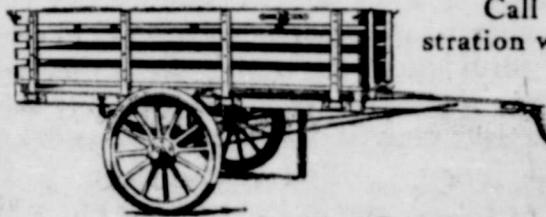

### *To the People of Texas and their Legislators Elect:*

This is a paid advertisement intended to give reasons why the present law of Texas relating to the incorporation of oil companies should be amended so as to allow Texas corporations like those of other states to pursue all of the several branches of this single business.

The Texas Company is engaged in purchasing, refining and marketing petroleum, and as a part of its business owns and operates a system of pipe lines. It is incorporated under the laws of Texas and is handicapped seriously by the inadequacy of its charter powers. It has no direct power to prospect for and produce crude oil. And as the law now stands it can obtain this power only by reorganizing and taking out a charter in some other state, thus becoming a corporation of that state and ceasing to be a corporation of Texas.

Heretofore the stockholders, by a separate producing organization, have borne the burden of obtaining the necessary crude supplies; and but for this arrangement the company could not have succeeded. This was workable when the organization was small and operations were on a narrow scale. But with the growth of the business and with varying and shifting stock ownership it has become subject to too many complications. The company is now manufacturing in Texas and marketing in nearly every country in the world the various finished products of Texas crude oil. It now has more than 10,000 employees, and its stockholders number about 4,000, including approximately 2,000 employees.

The competitors of this company are engaged in all branches of the business. Two of its principal competitors in Texas operate as limited partnerships or joint stock associations and therefore may pursue any business that an individual might pursue, the only restriction being such stipulations as the shareholders see fit to make among themselves. Another principal competitor is organized as a holding company, incorporated under the laws of another state, and owns the stock of three Texas corporations, one engaged in producing oil, another in refining and marketing, and a third in operating pipe lines, so that on the whole the stockholders have the benefit of an organization which covers all branches of the business.

The statement just made is not in criticism. The plan of including all branches of a single business is logical. Moreover, as applied to the oil business it is universal in all of the oil producing states and in foreign countries. In practically every state of the Union, except Texas, a corporation of this kind has the charter power to produce oil.

And it may not be inappropriate to say further in this connection that the limitations which the laws of Texas place on the charter powers of The Texas Company do not stop at the boundaries of the state; they follow the company wherever it goes; they follow it into other states and foreign countries where its competitors carry on all branches of the business and where the state of Texas can not prevent them from doing so. If anywhere on the Globe this company should do an act in excess of its powers as defined by the laws of Texas its charter would be subject to forfeiture.

No one would think of precluding a company engaged in the lumber business from going directly to the natural source of supply, taking timber leases or buying standing timber, and in that way acquiring its raw material. There as in the oil business the manufacturing merchant takes the raw or crude material and turns it into finished products. In each case the supply is limited as regards both locality and extent and the matter of obtaining supplies of the particular kinds needed and obtaining them at the times when needed and in the places where needed is of supreme importance. The same thought may be applied to mining or any industry where the operator must lay out large sums in plant and marketing facilities and is not warranted in doing so unless he is to have a free hand in obtaining the raw material. He must be allowed to protect his investment, otherwise he is at the mercy of hostile forces and can be destroyed at their will or upon an event of chance. To exclude an oil company from taking leases and producing oil, and thereby require it to buy from those who may happen to have wells and produce some oil, would mean to any concern operating on a large scale precisely the same that it would mean to the owner of a sawmill if he should be prohibited from acquiring standing timber and required to buy his logs at retail. And furthermore, as previously indicated, it is not a question of what might be ideal if we were at the inception of this industry; the business has pitched itself along certain lines; and these lines are universal and world-wide.

The position of The Texas Company was fully explained to the last legislature, but there was opposition to the bill introduced for its relief, and the matter was delayed and finally crowded out near adjournment. The company did not then, and it does not now, ask any special favors, or for the enactment of a law which would not apply to all similarly situated, or for any change in the settled policies of the state; but it did desire and it still desires some fair and suitable relief; such legislation as will remove the handicap and accord it those lawful corporate rights that are enjoyed by companies organized in such states as California, Oklahoma or Louisiana. It will present the matter to the Thirty-fifth Legislature.

# Methodists Let Contract Saturday for \$17,000 Church Building.

The building committee appointed by the Board of Trustees of the Methodist church last Saturday let the contract for the erection of the new Methodist church building to Contractor Wm. Johnson of San Antonio on his bid of \$17,000. The plans and specifications for the edifice are by Architect Ralph H. Cameron of San Antonio, and while embodying the principal features set forth in his preliminary plans, as described in The Standard a couple months ago, there are numerous changes and improvements that characterize the building as one of the most modern and complete in this section.

Impressive ceremonies will mark the breaking of the ground on next Monday, and an immense gathering, not only from among an enthusiastic membership, but from Brady and McCulloch county citizens, all of whom take the greatest of pride in the new edifice, is to be staged upon that occasion.

The building is to be of reinforced concrete, with brick facing and metal tile roof, not only making it absolutely fire-proof but giving a building that will endure throughout generations. Two shades of brick—a light brown and a darker brown—are to be used, giving a most attractive and pleasing appearance.

The building will be located on the north-west corner of the block owned by the Methodist church, and will front on both Blackburn street and the intersecting street. Two main entrances will be provided, one at the north-west corner and another at the south-west corner of the building, a flight of about twelve steps leading to the first floor and auditorium. Not only will this elevation make the edifice doubly imposing, but it will enable a well-lighted and well-ventilated basement. The basement will house the furnace and heating apparatus, a system of hot-air heating having been decided upon. Class rooms will be placed on the south, west and north sides of the basement, and together with the rooms similarly located on the 1st floor will accommodate 20 classes. A unique example of the perfect floor plan is had in the fact that all class rooms are connected, and the pastor can begin at his study on the southeast corner and visit all the class rooms both in the basement and on the first floor without once entering the main part of the building. The floor of the basement will be of concrete.

The main auditorium will be 42x42 feet in dimension. On the north and south sides will be extensions, which will be used as Sunday school rooms. At the south-east corner will be the pastor's study, and in the east will be the pulpit and chancel. The choir room will be north of and adjoining the pastor's study and will enable the members of the choir to pass directly to the choir loft to the rear of the chancel. The kitchen will be located at the north-east corner, and the Sunday school room on the north is readily convertible into a dining hall with a capacity of 150 people.

The Sunday school rooms on the main floor will be separated from the auditorium by disappearing partitions, and when these are removed the seating capacity of the main auditorium will be increased to 600. Special attention has been given to the lighting and ventilation. A sky-light just over

the choir loft will give the maximum light for the members of the choir upon all occasions, while prism glass will be used to diffuse the rays of light and soften the glare of the sun. Surrounding the immense arched dome will be windows permitting ventilation. These windows will be hidden from view, so that in no instance will the glaring sun disturb the worshippers, but instead the softened light will aid them in their devotions.

Because of the modern style of architecture, the acoustics will be perfect and there will be no re-echoing sounds to annoy or render difficult the hearing of the sermons. So perfect, in fact, will be the acoustics, that the dropping of a pin from any part of the building will be distinctly heard.

Following the completion of the building, the grounds will be terraced, and shrubbery and flowers will complete the adornment of the site.

While the cost of the building is set at \$17,000, the total cost will easily reach \$20,000. This sum includes the architect's fees, seating, furnishing and equipping of the building.

Architect Cameron and Contractor Johnson have already earned the confidence of Brady citizens in the splendid Masonic temple, which was designated by the former and built by the latter, and which is recognized as one of the most modern, most complete and most attractive edifices in his section of Texas, and everyone is confident that the new Methodist church building will likewise rebound to their credit, as well as being a source of pride with and commendation to the community.

that Brady and McCulloch county roads have been logged and placed on the tourist maps. At present the roads are all in very good shape, but the first spell of bad weather will put them to a test that many will be unable to withstand successfully. In that event, the tourists who find traveling through this county of great pleasure now, will find the reverse conditions true—and instead of acting to the county's benefit, the opposite will be had, for every traveler will give warning to fellow travelers to avoid bad stretches of road.

Just how important it is that the road improvement be allowed to progress rapidly and unhindered may easily be understood. Should Road District No. 2 vote for the issuance of good roads bonds, as it is to be earnestly hoped will be the case, it will enable the linking of that district with Road District No. 1 in a chain of good roads. Doubtless such action would be followed by the creation of a Road District No. 3 in the south part of the county, forming another important link in the chain of good roads. With this much accomplished there is no doubt but what every community in the county will see the importance and necessity of road improvement.

Every citizen should be for good roads. Every citizen should not only talk and work for good roads, but when the questions comes up at the polls, let his voice be for good roads.

#### DELINQUENTS.

With this issue The Standard begins the publication of the delinquent tax list, showing all property upon which there now is assessed a delinquent tax. This list covers a period of 31 years, or to be exact, from the year 1885 up to 1916, and its compilation and publication is mandatory upon the part of the county officials under the provisions of House Bill No. 40, Acts of the 34th Legislature of the State of Texas.

The average reader has not the slightest conception of the hugeness of the task the compilation of this list has imposed upon the county tax collectors office. To go over the mass of records for the past 31 years, to compile them, figure out penalties, etc., has been undertaking comparable only the Labors of Hercules. Probably the editor and the force of The Standard can come nearest appreciating the immensity of the undertaking. The list, as published, is probably something over half of the entire list compiled by Tax Assessor Mayo, a large number of citizens having already paid their delinquent assessments and having their tracts and property thereby removed from the delinquent list. The setting of this list occupied the time of two men and the linotype machine almost continuously for practically six weeks, working every moment of the time not devoted to the setting of matter for the regular editions of The Standard and continuing the labors every night until 11:00 o'clock. The reading of the entire list for correction required the services of two men almost an entire week, and nearly another week was required by two men to set and insert the cor-

rections and get the list ready for printing. The printing of the list itself is no small undertaking, and for the three weeks that it is to be published requires nearly two days' work on a press printing four pages at one time. Needless to say, the entire force heaves a sigh of relief now that the immense task is so nearly completed and when we say completed, we mean it—for it is not at all likely The Standard or any of The Standard force will ever have opportunity or occasion to labor again on a task of this size and nature.
