WAR ON MOSQUITOES.

Dr. W. L. Jennings, City Health Officer of Coleman, desires that the people be reminded of the importance of combating the mosquito early in the game by eliminating his breeding place. Every person who has an open cistern, rain barrel, or permits water to stand in tin cans or other vessels about his premises, is unwittingly venient; Lever Seals are the maintaining a mosquito hatchery.
Nearly everyone has seen "wrigglers"
or "wiggletails" in a vessel of water, a puddle, or rain barrel, but casual glance usually does not convince one that these strange looking creatures are nothing else than the young of mosquitoes. If the reader is inclined to doubt it, just tie a mosquito net over a jar of water containing these wrigglers and watch them for a week to see the transformation. Mosquitoes usually do not fly far from their breeding places-the mosquitoes that anyou on a summer evening probably grow in a street gutter near your louse, or in a chicken trough in your back yard, or in any standing water not more than a block or two awaytin cans, dishes, bottles, troughs, rain barrels, in fact any vessel of water which is not changed frequently is capable of rearing mosquitoes. While they are wrigglers they may be des-troyed by an occasional application of kerosine on the surface of the water where they are breeding. —Coleman Democrat-Voice.

WONDER WORDS.

This Is Wonder, Ore. - Also Here's How Tree Ducks Do. Wonder, Ore., May 19. Editor Brady Standard:

In my description of Wonder, I forgot to mention a few potent items of identification. Namely: At the northwest corner of the store and postoffice building at the end of the porch floats Old Glory at the top end of the longest flagpole you ever saw ac-cording to the size of it. Sixty feet long and only six inches in diameter at its base and three at the apex. I had a time raising it. I climbed a tree and attached a block and tackle to hoist it with, and used guy ropes attached to the flue on top of the building and to a tree on the opposite side to keep it (the pole) from swing-

ing to either side.

Over the front door is painted the sign "Wonder Postoffice," and projecting through the front porch floor is a gasoline pump, where the way-ward traveler may replenish his thirs-ty automobile. And at the edge of the porch projecting two feet above the surface of the ground is a four-inch metal stake with a copper cap-ping on the top of which is inscribed "U. S. Geological Survey. Elevation above sea, 1077 feet. 250 dollar fine for disturbing this mark."

Off to the south about a mile is Mt. Wonder, the summit of which is perhaps 2000 feet higher, from the base of which flows a brook, the water of which is so cold it makes your fingers tingle to wash in it. It is really too cold to irrigate with, but I use it for that purpose nevertheless; depending upon the sun to warm the ground afterward. Back of the store is a well of water of just about the same temperature. In the front yard are thousands of lilacs, roses and other flowers including native Oregon lillies, which are very fragrant. Also ome beautiful cone shaped native firs and cedars twenty feet which were only one foot high when I set them out fifteen years ago.
