#### FUEL SHORTAGE IN **BRADY BECOMES** SERIOUS PROBLEM

The fuel shortage in Brady has become so serious that a shut-down of all local industries is imminent. In fact, every business depending upon the Brady Water & Light Works for power, has been forced to close down since Tuesday

The businesses affected include the Brady Standard, The Brady Sentinel, Brady Steam Laundry, the meat markets-in fact, all enterprises depending upon electricity from the municipal plant to operate their motors and machinery.

This will explain the delay in the issuance of this issue of The Standard! It will also give the reason for any delay or non-appearance of our Friday issue!

The Brady Water & Light Works has two cars of coal and one of fuel oil-enroute. The coal was at first confiscated, but later released -but it has not yet reached here. In the meantime, in common with other local industries using fuel oil, they have been borrowing and swapping for fuel from those who happen to have a supply on hand. The local supply has run so low that Tuesday the power plant only sought to keep up enough steam to pump water, thus supplying the citizens with this necessity, as well as maintaining a supply for fire protection, and also enabling the gins, compress and oil mills to keep up steam.

Wednesday, power has been promised for all day to enable the newspapers, laundry and other users of motors to get in a full day's work, thereby partly catching up. Beyond that no promises are forthcoming.

The laundry recently obtained a car of lignite, dividing it with the city. They can operate their plant with coal, but cannot fire their boilers with lignite, and depend upon the city to furnish power for their irons, and other ma-

Embry's gin reports enough coal on hand to run about two weeks. They can fire their boilers with fuel oil, if oil can be obtained.

The Planter's gin is being supplied with fuel by the Brady Cotton Oil Co. until a car of oil enroute from Corsicana for the past ten days

Koerth's gin is also kept running on oil obtained from the Brady Cotton Oil Co.

The McCulloch County Cotton Oil Mill is out of fuel and will be closed down Wednesday awaiting arrival of delayed shipments from various points.

The Brady Cotton Oil Mill is the only local concern now having a supply of fuel oil, and it is very limited. At that, manager Klatt is dividing it out among the gins and is also furnishing the light and power plant. In this manner, it is hoped to bridge over the fuel famine until some of the long-expected shipments of oil or coal, enroute from various points in Oklahoma or Texas, can be received. The refineries are from 8 to 10 days late in starting shipments, and the railroads move the tank cars on an average of but 11 miles per day.


