Effective January 1st, our display advertising rate will be 25 cents per column inch.

As we are unable to make a contract, for print paper at any price, we can make no contract with any advertiser.

The smaller newspaper publishers are up against a hard proposition. . Newsprint paper is scarce and hard to get. The paper that this issue of The Brady Standard is printed on, cost us fully 50% more than the highest war-time price-and we were glad to get it at any price.

We have had orders in for more paper for over a month but to date the paper supply houses have not been able to get us ony. The large city publishers are getting most of the paper-and they are paying for it, in car lots f. o. b. the mills, as high as 13 cents per pound. This paper they formerly bought for 21/2 cents per pound.

The Brady Standard will next year limit its size to 12 pages. Under no circumstances will we print more than this. If conditions in the paper market get worse, as seems probable now, the number of pages will be reduced.

Effective January 1st, The Standard will also adopt the Franklin Price List as a guide in the making of prices on job printing. This price list has the endorsement of the Texas Typothetae, and is universally commended by printers everywhere in the U.S., who are using it as being fair, reliable and
