 Effective July 1st next the yearly subscript $n$ price ofThe Bract Standard will be increased to $\$ 2.00$ pe year. To

The increase is made necessary on account of
Earlier in the year, The Standard secured enough paper asit thought, to run us through the year. The steady increase of print paper for other work, has practically depleted our stock. We have requested quotations from half a dozen dif-
ferent supply houses, and the best quotation we have been able to get is 12 c per pound-snd, at that, they did not have a sheet of paper on hand to sell. Another house advised that hey wouid make us a shipment of a fraction of a ton at whatever price market conditions demanded at time of shipment. The Standard his delayed maling an announcement increase in price as long as possible, but must now submit to the inevitable. Should the price of print paper ever again return to anything like normal, we will be just as eager to an-
nounce a reduction in the subscription price, as we have been reluctant to announce an increase.
