Social Security Act Amendments Concern World War II Vets

The 1950 amendments of the Social Security Act contain an important provision which concerns the men and women who served in our armed forces during World War II. The act now provides wage credits of \$160 for each month of military service in World War II.

This change may qualify many widows and children of those who were killed in action or who have died since the war. Benefits may be payable with the month of September, 1950. This provision would affect unremarried widows and children under age 18 on September 1, 1950. Also, in some cases, parents who were receiving at least one-half of their total support from the service man or woman at the time of his death would be entitled to payments.

In addition to allowing the payments mentioned above, the adding of military service credits would result in some present payments being increased. This would be the case if the added credits would increase the average monthly wage of the deceased.

Anyone who feels this change in the law would affect their present payments or would entitle them to payments is urged to contact the Amarillo Social Security office for further information.





NOTICE OF COUNTY'S INTENTION TO RECEIVE BIDS FOR THE PURCHASE OF CERTAIN ROAD MACHINERY, AND TO ISSUE TIME WARRANTS TO EVIDENCE THE INDEBTNESS TO BE CREATED THEREFORE.

SEALED BIDS, addressed to ROBERT ESTES, County Judge of Castro County, Texas, at Dimmitt, Texas, will be received at the office of the County Judge until 2:00 o'clock p. m., on the 13th day of November, 1950, for the purchase of the following road machinery for the maintenance and improvement of the roads in and for said County, to-wit:

One (1) Road Maintainer, ap-

proximately 100 HP, to weigh not less than 22,000 lbs., equipped with cab, lights, heater, electric starter device, and left and right mole-board extensions.

SUCH PROPOSALS will at said time be publicly opened and read before the Commissioners' Court.

A CERTIFIED CHECK, or cashier's check in the amount of five per cent (5%) of the amount of the bid, must accompany each bid.

IT IS THE INTENTION OF THE COMMISSIONERS' COURT to pay all or a portion of the purchase price of such road machinery by the issuance and delivery to the proper contractor or contractors, of the legally issued time warrants of said County, bearing interest at a rate not to exceed 4% per annum, payable annually or semi-annually, which said warrants shall not exceed the principal sum of \$9,000, and the principal of said warrants shall be payable serially, the maximum maturity date to be not later than May 15, 1959. The County guarantees that the contractor, or contractors, will receive face value for such warrants when and as the same are issued and delivered.

THE RIGHT is reserved by Castro County to reject any and all proposals or to waive all technicalities.

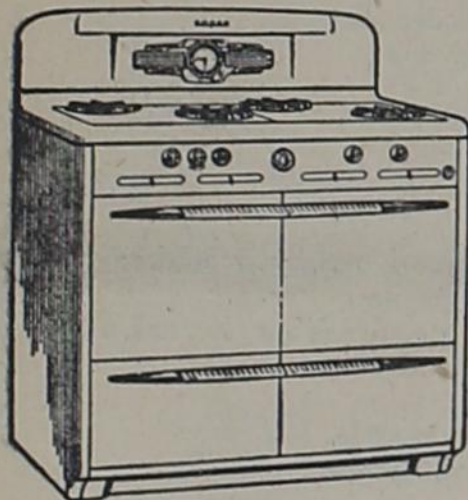

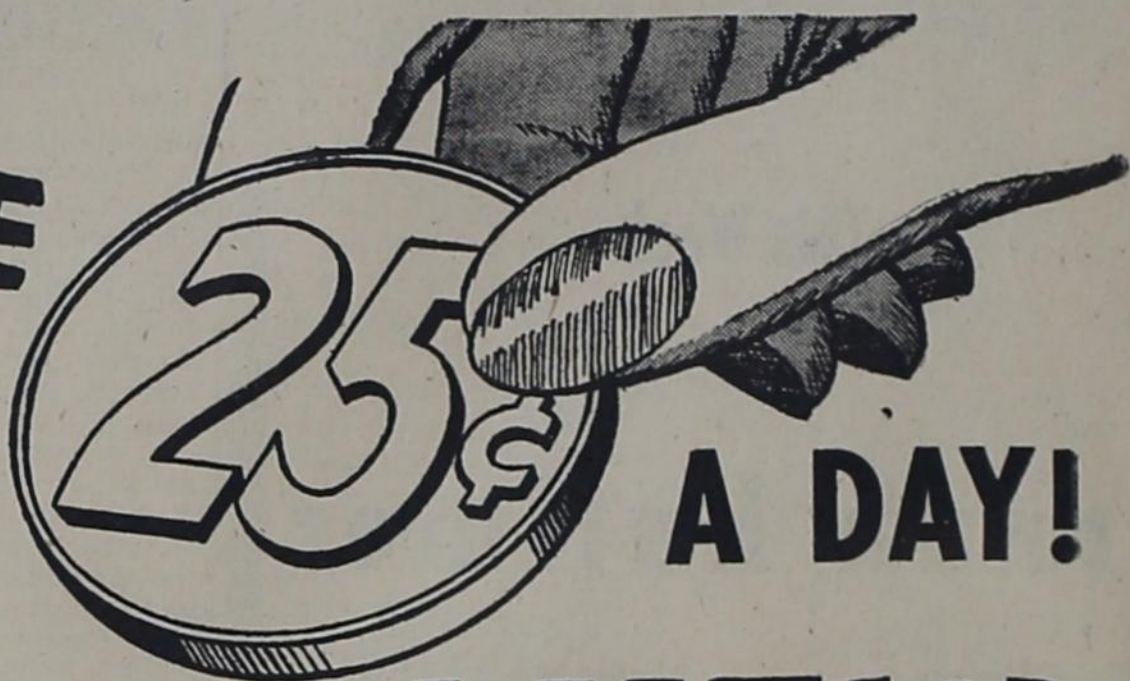
