

# Harman's to Build New Store Here; Move-In Date Estimated August 1

Harman's Department Store will begin construction of their new building just north of their present location as soon as the lots are cleared.

The frame-and-stucco building which formerly housed Umberson Radio and TV is being torn down and the Steak House Cafe building will be moved. Both structures have belonged to Harman's Department Store for some time.

Of concrete tile with brick veneer, the new building with measure out at 4,375 square feet of floor space with a fifty-foot front. Plate glass show windows will be installed in the traffic-light corner of the building and along the east front.

Killingsworth Construction Co. was awarded contract for the structure and completion date is expected to be about August 1. Refrigerated air and forced heat will climatize the new building and asphalt tile will be used on the floors.

"This new building signifies our faith in Dimmitt and Castro County," Bill Harman, store manager, said. "We have felt the need for more floor space for a long time, and we believe we can offer better and more efficient service to our customers."

Mr. S. L. Harman founded the Harman Department Stores in Hereford and Dimmitt. The Dimmitt store will continue to operate in the present location until the new building is finished.

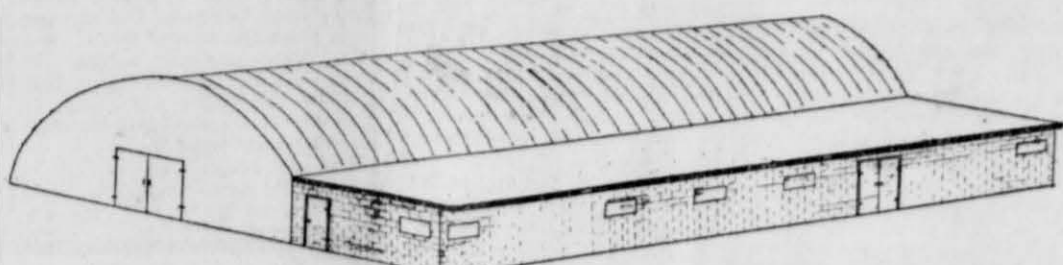

This is an artist's conception of what the new American Legion Hall in Dimmitt will look like when completed. ## 15 Democratic Precinct Conventions Saturday; County Meet on Tuesday

The long road to the National Democratic Convention in Chicago this August will begin Saturday with precinct conventions all over the state.

In Castro County fifteen precinct conventions will be held (one for each voting box.) Chief director to be made will be whether to send Governor Shivers or Senator Lyndon Johnson as state delegation head to the national convention.

After the precinct convention Saturday will come the county convention Tuesday, May 8, and the State Convention on Tuesday May 22 in Dallas.

All precinct conventions begin at exactly 3 p. m. Saturday and all qualified voters are urged to be at their convention site shortly before that time.

According to W. E. Kirkpatrick, Democratic Party chairman for Castro County, the precinct conventions will be held as follows:

- Precinct 1 (Dimmitt voting box No. 1) in commissioner's court room
- Precinct 2 (Dimmitt voting box No. 2) in the District Court Room.
- Precinct 3 (Dimmitt voting box No. 3) in the County Agent's office.
- Precinct 4 (Dimmitt voting box No. 4) in the County Judge's office.
- Precinct 5 (South Nazareth) at the Ed Brockman home.
- Precinct 6 (Hart) at Hart High School.
- Precinct 7 (Bethel) at Bethel community building.
- Precinct 8 (Jumbo) at Jumbo community building.
- Precinct 9 (Summerfield) at regular voting place.
- Precinct 10 (Sunnyside) at Sunnyside community building.
- Precinct 11 (Big Square) at Big Square community building.
- Precinct 12 (North Nazareth) at Nazareth community hall.
- Precinct 13 (Arney) at Arney school house.
- Precinct 14 (Frio) at Frio school house.
- Precinct 15 (Easter) at Easter community building.

Each precinct convention may send one delegate to the county convention for each twenty-five votes cast in the last general election for the democratic gubernatorial candidate.

At the precinct conventions any qualified voter may call the meeting to order if the precinct chairman is not present promptly at 3 p. m. Only people who have paid their poll tax, old age or first vote exemptions may attend the convention. All others should be asked to leave the room. This includes those not residing in the precinct in which the convention is being held. Article 13.34 of the Election Code says no person can take part in, or vote in, the precinct convention unless his or her name appears on the poll tax list.

Voting precincts in Dimmitt are designated by imaginary intersecting lines crossing at the court house. Anyone living south-east of the courthouse is in precinct 1; southwest, precinct 2; northwest, precinct 3; and northeast, precinct 4. The east and west dividing line runs through town along the alley one block south of highway 86 and the south-north dividing line runs one-half block east of highway 81.

The Castro County Democratic convention will be May 8 beginning at 3 p. m. in the District Court Room, Mr. Kirkpatrick said.

## Francis Jackson Suffers From SLE In California

Mr. Francis Lee Jackson, son of Mr. F. U. Jackson of Dimmitt, has been reported slightly improved and is home from the hospital in San Jose, Calif., after an eight-month illness.

His ailment has been diagnosed as systemic lupus erythematosus, commonly called SLE. It resembles rheumatoid arthritis, but at the same time can affect kidneys, skin and other organs. It can be mistaken for arthritis, rheumatic fever, kidney disease and other ailments, according to California physicians.

Mr. Jackson attended Dimmitt High School and now lives in San Jose.

Although it is a serious disease, little is known about it. A Los Angeles hospital has studied the ailment intensively and has managed to chop the death rate of the disease to ten per cent in two years' time.

## Attempted Murder Suspect Found Shot to Death in North of County

A short Panhandle-wide man-hunt came to an abrupt halt Sunday morning when Melvin Otis Chandler, 46, was found shot to death about 17 miles northeast of Dimmitt by W. O. Coonau-gner, a farmer near the Arney community.

Chandler, an oil company salesman, was wanted for questioning in connection with the attempted slaying of Mrs. Onie Watson, 44, and her male companion, M. B. Chiles, 45, both of Amarillo. Both are still in serious condition.

Two suicide notes were found near Chandler's body expressing regret for what he had done. "I know I have done wrong I guess I just went crazy. I must have been out of my head," one note said. The note also revealed he had been praying shortly before his death. It is believed he killed himself thinking he had killed both Mrs. Watson and Chiles.

The other note was to a daughter in Greenville, in which Chandler apologized for his actions. "I guess I haven't been a very good father. I hope you will forgive me," the note read.

Chandler's body was taken to Dennis Funeral Home here to await the arrival of relatives.

Chiles said Chandler was hiding in the Watson home garage and he came out and started shooting when the couple arrived there. He told police he ran and grabbed Chandler after Mrs. Watson was shot. Chandler shot him twice, slugged him with the butt of the gun, and then shot him twice more, Chiles told police.

Mrs. Betty Wilkie, daughter of Mrs. Watson, said her mother had been a widow since World War II and had been going with Chandler for about two years, but had stopped seeing him after Chandler was alleged to have beaten her on several occasions.

The gun allegedly used in the shootings is in Sheriff Cartwright's office at this time. It is a worn-out .38 Smith and Wesson revolver with a faulty trigger and hammer mechanism and would be almost impossible for anyone not familiar with the weapon to fire it.

## Killingsworth And Page Win Paving Contract

Contract for the city's current paving program was let April 24 to Page and Killingsworth. They had a low bid of \$136,385.41 for the number of blocks approved.

About fifty blocks of paving are proposed under the contract. One-tenth of this figure will be paid by the city through a \$35,000 bond election last summer, which is expected to pay for alley entrances and intersections.

Dimmitt residents who wish to have streets paved in front of their lots should contact city hall immediately.

Streets will be thirty-three feet between outside extremes of curbs and property owners will be charged between \$5 and \$6 per linear foot of paving in front of their lots which includes curb and gutter.

Paving proposals call for hard-topping the street running east and west on the south side of Castro County Hospital to the city limits, which will also put it to the western extreme of the Miller addition.

Another proposal calls for connecting cemetery road in South Dimmitt and Highway 56 to South Pavement behind the football stadium and connecting the Wright Addition with Highway 86 is also planned. Other scattered blocks to make up the total are also on the drawing board.

## Jumbo HD History . . .

Home Demonstration club work was first started in Castro County in 1930 under the leadership of Miss Lottie Drennin. The Jumbo Club was one of the 13 clubs organized with Mrs. Clem Gilliam as president. From the very first Jumbo was an active club starting out with 13 members. Emphasis was placed on poultry and dairy products the first year. The most outstanding results of Miss Drennin's work was the making of American cheese. Some of the children of those days still talk of the good cheese we made at home and wonder why we didn't keep it up. Miss Drennin stayed only about a year and then married Don Head of Lubbock Experiment Station and they are still in that work.

1931 brought Miss Lora Clark to our county and the Jumbo club. She stayed five years and all the clubs in the county flourished under her leadership. Those were the depression days and she helped us wonderfully to learn how to grow and conserve our food.

Organization of Castro County Council was organized, which consisted of President, Secretary and 1 delegate from each Woman's Club—which met once a month in the county court house. Each club had a demonstrator and co-operator to carry on the club projects. The first projects were: Fowl preservation, Poultry and Dairy work. Also clothing and bedroom work.

Canning with pressure cooker, and using tin cans were the methods used in preserving food.

The food demonstrator had a

monument in her home and invited the members and husbands. They spent the day and with the help of the County Agent (who killed the animals) and the Home Demonstration Agent—would can all the meat in one day. Roast, sausage, lard, liver paste scrapple and chili were the most common products canned. We also learned to cure pork and store it in cotton seed oil. These were the depression days and we had to utilize everything. People who raised it, had it, and those who didn't often went without.

The Jumbo club has been an active club and has accomplished many things. We have prospered on down the years as the other clubs have prospered, but we still think of the good old days in the 30ties when we worked together and learned so many things from our demonstration agents that have helped us so much through the years, that have contributed to the health of our children.

Little did we think when we were canning so much food twenty years ago, that the day would come when we would have a deep freeze to conserve our food.

Now the Demonstration Agent teaches us the latest method to prepare food for our deep freeze. Now we all have electricity, paved roads and irrigation wells. Will the next twenty years bring as much change as the last twenty? Certainly we have all made progress and we owe much of our health and prosperity to the wonderful agents who have helped us all so tirelessly down through the years.

4-H Clubs were also organized during the early thirties. The children were active then—as now—in learning the things that helped them all through life.

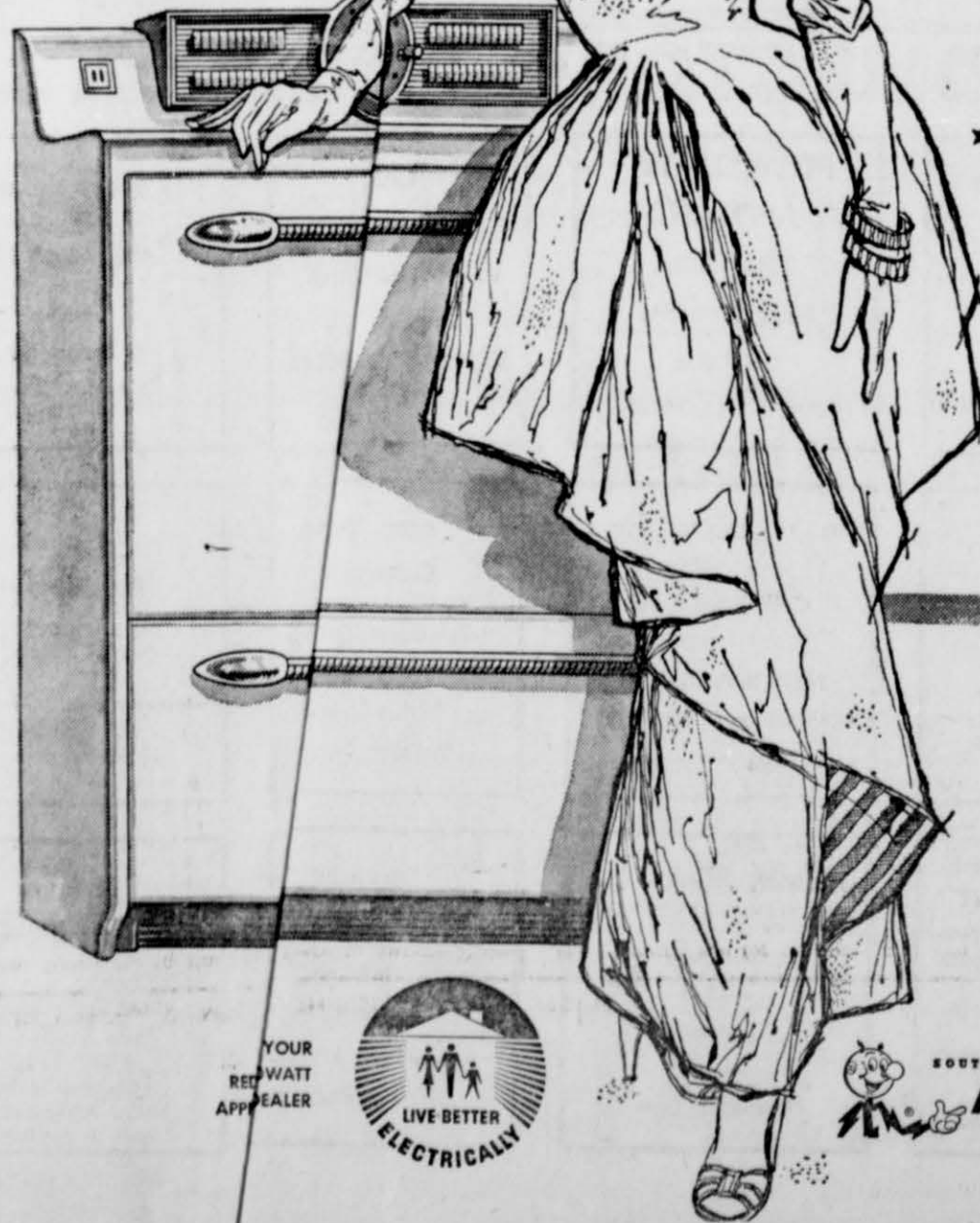

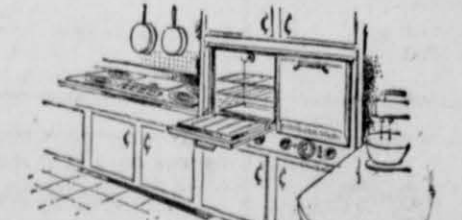
