A statement by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation follows:

The purpose of the signs is to let depositors know which banks are insured. Heretofore, although 90 per cent easy means of identifying them.

If by any unforeseen circumstances, an insured bank should suspend, the Insurance Corporation would begin paying off the depositors just as soon as a receiver was appointed for the closed institution. The depositors would receive their money in a few days instead of waiting months or years as was the case in the former method of liquidation. This is not only a benefit to the depositors but it saves the community from a terrible economic and social blow. When the depositors receive their insured accounts they assign their claims to the Insurance Corporation.
