The Bronte boys fairly socked the ball, driving out plenty of long high ones to all parts of the outfield, but the Veri Best outfield was really up on their game, allowing none of the drives to get through for a hit.

Sunday's game was a thriller—and was attended by the largest number of fans to witness a game on the Bronte field this season. The weather was good the boys were right, and the fans were fairly dishing out the "razz". The Veri Best nine were tough—plenty tough—but the Bronte boys were a "little tougher."

Regular fine for drunks is \$9, but he deducted \$1.50 for the night in jail and the work the son had done. The mother counted out the money, it looked like all she had. Reluctantly, the sergeant took the seven paper

dollars and the fifty-cent piece. He knew it wasn't her fault the son seemed to have a nose for trouble.

The son came forth sheepishly from the cell, hung his head as the sergeant made out the receipt for his release. "Be good, now," he cautioned, as he gave the son leave to go.

"I won't do this again," said the mother as she and the son left the room.

Most of us who realize the sacrifices mothers make for us know she didn't mean it. She'll probably be back again when her son gets into trouble.

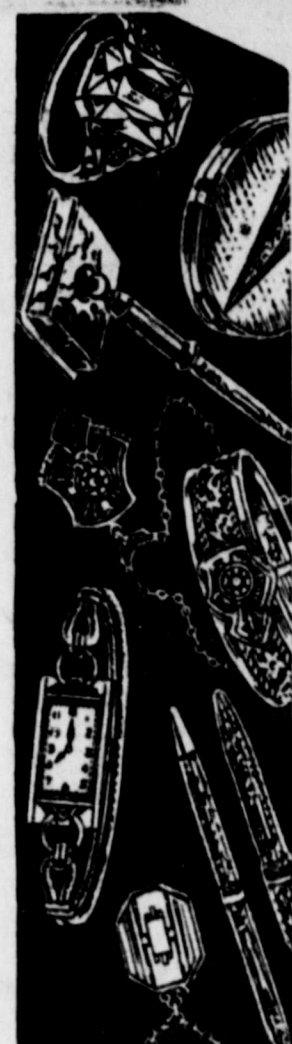
