

In addition to the taxes, interest and penalty, there will be such court costs as may accrue.

It has come to me, that it is Street corner gossip that these taxes are not collectable by suit; To those relying upon such information, I suggest that a good lawyer be immediately con-sulted. As these taxes most certainly can be, and will be collected.

Such taxes constitute a lien created by the Constitution against the property, and this lien will be forclosed in a proper suit instituted for that purpose.
