## Dear Editor:

As most everyone is aware, the Bronte and Marie school districts will vote on Saturday, Octower 7, 1939, on the question of the consolidation of the Marie Dist ict with the Bronte District. The main thought that comes into most peo-
ples minds in a situation of this kind is whether the incommg district will be a benefit or a liability to the receiving dis trict. With that question in mind, I quote for your con sideration some estimated figures on the financial side. Estimated income from the Marie District:

The estimated expense balanced against the estimated receipts leaves a balance of $\$ 665$ on the income side. 1 feel that this is a fair estimate as the possible reductions in the income have been substracted while the estimated expense has been figured at the minimum. These figuees are based on a minimum of thirty scholastics while the
