March is the month for taking the scholastic census. The age limits are from six to seventeen years old inclusive on the first day of this coming September. If your child has had his or her sixth birthday since the first day of last September, or will have his or her 6th birthday between now and the first of the coming September, he or she must be given in on the census or if he or she will now have their eighteenth birthday between now and September 1, 1941, he or she must be given in on the census regardless of whether he or she attends school, is married or otherwise. Every patron of this school should take it upon themselves to see that every child within the ages is properly given in, for through that medium the school gains a goodly part of its finance. The children are four sons, Olin, Felix, Alfred all of Bronte, and Boone of Lariat, Texas; the daughters are Mrs. J. T. Ellis of McMahan, Mrs. H. E. Rogers of Bronte, Mrs. Trannie Best of Bronte, one daughter died in infancy; besides the husband and children, sixteen grand children and five great grand children survive.

In early girlhood deceased became a member of the Baptist church and at death was a member of the Bronte Baptist church.

Funeral services were held at the Bronte Baptist church, Wednesday afternoon, the pastor, Rev. J. E. Eldridge, assisted by Rev. B. M. Bohmfalk, pastor of the Methodist church, conducted the services.

Pall bearers were M. A. Butler, F. S. Higginbotham, John Coalson, I. M. Cumbie, Tige Richards, Jesse Eads.

Following the religious services interment was in Fairview cemetery.

Mrs. R. J. Gaines Dies Suddenly, After Operation

Friends of the family were shocked when the news came of the death of Mrs. R. J. Gaines in a San Angelo hospital, Thursday afternoon, February 27, 1941.

As The Enterprise understands it, deceased underwent an operation and shortly thereafter unexpectedly to the attending physician and the nurses, she died.

Deceased was born in Bell county, May 28, 1896, making her to be in her forty-fifth year when death so unexpectedly claimed her.

August 18, 1912 deceased was married to R. J. Gaines at Blackwell, since which time they made their home at Blackwell and Bronte, having resided here the past nine years. To them four children were born. The children are Jimmie W. of Englewood, California, Miss Lovrine of Abilene, Mrs. Laverne Hannah of Houston, Wendell, the baby boy. Kemp of Hereford. All were present for the funeral, except Mrs. Davis.

When only 13 years old deceased united with the Baptist church. Religious services were conducted at the Bronte Baptist church, Saturday afternoon, by Pastor J. E. Eldridge, assisted by Rev. B. M. Bohmfalk, pastor of the Bronte Methodist church. Interment followed the religious services, in Fairview cemetery.

**TUBERCULAR DEATHS
 REDUCED TO SIXTH
 PLACE IN TEXAS**

Austin, Texas, March 5—"Tuberculosis, like cancer, may be called an undercover disease. Its ability to harm and kill is based on the amount of time it has at its disposal to undermine the system before it is discovered. This factor, which in part can be influenced by public health measures, is one of the biggest stumbling blocks in a further drastic reduction of tuberculosis deaths," states Dr. Geo. W. Cox, State Health Officer.

Formerly, tuberculosis occupied the unenviable position of number one in the causes of death. Through the years it has gradually relinquished its preeminence, and in Texas now is in sixth place. However, between the ages of 14 to 45 it still holds first place. Even at that, this means that during 1939, latest year on which complete Texas mortality figures are available, 3,911 persons in the State were its victims; despite the fact that never before has science been so well equipped to fight tuberculosis successfully as it is today.

The majority of persons suffering with undetected tuberculosis usually have themselves to blame for their ignorance of their illness because, despite consistent loss of weight, faulty digestion, poor appetite, and loss of strength or the existence of a tired feeling in the afternoon, they fail to bring their condition to the attention of a physician. Not only is early detection the best guarantee of arresting the disease, but it also

serves to protect others in the family by removing the dangers surrounding the unrecognized contact case.

Modern tuberculosis treatment in homes and sanatoria has been a boon to thousands and a protection against the disease to thousands more. However, personal cooperation, in the form of taking one's earliest suspicious symptoms to the family doctor for a check-up, needs to be more generally applied if the fight against this devastator of life is to show marked progress.

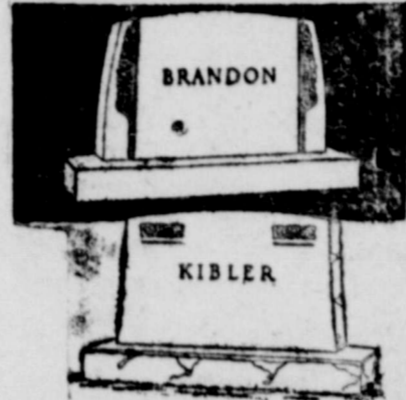

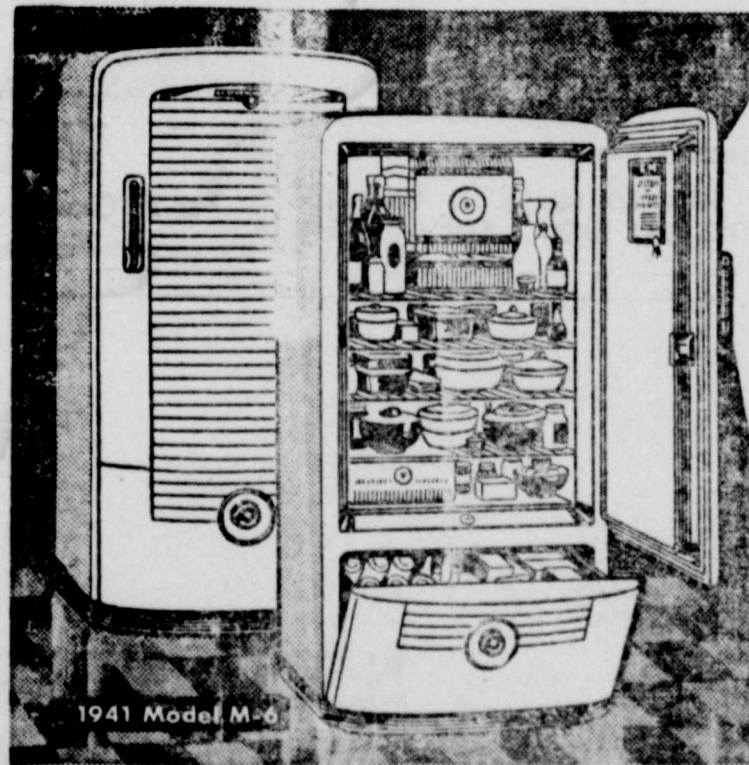
