A hospital financed in this manner will put a burden on the property owners of the county for many, many years to come, and if it follows the trend shown by many such organizations, it will not only be expensive from the initial investment standpoint, but it will never be selfsustaining and the upkeep and operating expense will be an additional drain on the taxpayers.

Naturally, the people on the east side of the county are not in favor of building a county hospital. They are provided with first class medical care in a hospital here which was financed by private capital and we can see no reason why the people on the west side of the county should not be provided for in the same manner.

Nobody in Bronte objects to a hospital at Robert Lee. It would be an asset to the town and to the entire county, but, from what the Enterprise can determine, the voters around here DO object to footing a large part of the bill for an institution for which they have no need and which they would never use.
