The Dimmitt Cemetery Association Corporation was organized Monday afternoon at a mass meeting of interested citizens in the District Court Room. Mr. Mark Cowsert served as chaiman and Mr. Kenneth Turner served as secretary.

By Laws and Constitution, drawn up by a previously appointed committee, were read by the secretary and adoptd by the association. Following the adoption of the constitution and By-Laws, the following board of directors was elected: Mark Cowsert, president; K. E. Turner, secretary-treasurer, Mrs. E. F. Sadler, Bob McLain, Mrs. Perry Graham, George Webb and Earl Lust.

Application for a corporation charter is being made at the Secretary of State by the Dimmitt Cemetery Association, which will be vested with legal authority to trans act business and look after the affairs and property of the cemetery.

Tentative plans are to assess all lot owners in the cemetery with annual dues and to solicit contributions from all other interested persons. All funds derived through these sources will be used for the beautification and upkeep of the cemetery. A full-time caretaker sponsored nationally by the Nationwill be employed to keep the burying place in good condition at all times.
