





Mrs. Annie Wilkins has recently ompleted a Great Plains Conseration Program plan on her farm outh of Bronte. Practices for this ear include rootplowing and seedng on 37 acres, a concrete reseroir for livestock water and 1,000 eet of net wire diversions. The cootplowed area is to be seeded o a mixture of Blue panicum, Switchgrass and Sideoats grama. The area will be deferred for a ull growing season before grazing o allow grasses to become estabished. Mrs. Wilkins also plans to out some of her cropland back to mixture of Blue panicum, Indiangrass and Sand lovegrass. The and is to be retired because it is sandy and difficult to manage under row crops.

Another Great Plains Conservation Program plan has been completed by H. C. Grafa on his place miles southeast of Bronte. Grafa's plans include pitting and seeding 20 acres to a mixture of Sideoats grama, Buffalograss, Switchgrass and Blue panicum. The pitting is being done to add a seed source of better grasses on his pastures and will be rested at least one full growing season following seeding. In addition to this he plans to construct a concrete reservoir and a pond for stock water and to practice proper use and deferment on his rangeland.


