This type building does away with all supports which might hamper the vision of those attending services. The structure is centrally air conditioned and heated. Indirect lighting is used throughout. In the back of the building are located a Sunday School classroom on one side of the entrance and the minister's study on the other side. A large foyer occupies the space

> Constructed over these rooms is a balcony which has been designed to house the church's nursery. It is glassed in so those using it. can see the rest of the congregation, but is practically sound proof, thus eliminating disturbing noises. A loud speaker in the nursery allows persons occupying the room to hear the services.

A new baptistry has been installed at the back of the pulpit. It is made of steel and has been covered with blue fiberglass.


