Childress Firm Submits Low Bid on Two Kickapoo Dams

2 p. m. Tuesday when directors of the Coke County Water Costrol and Improvement District

Eight bids were received on the project. Second low bidder was T. L. Free Co. of Ballinger which submitted an offer of \$152,053.02. The other bids ranged upward to the high bid of S. A. Construction Co., of Dallas which submitted a bid of \$189,163.60.

F. S. Higginbotham, president of the water district said Tuesday afternoon that construction on the dams will start about Jan. 15. He said 318 working days will be allowed for their completion.

Located on land belonging to Barton Waldrop and W. D. (Pete) McDonald, the two dams will be the first of six dams to be constructed in a flood control project which is expected to cost approximately \$1 million.

The project was deemed feasible several months ago after a thorough survey was made and it was determined that the area had suffered more than \$2 million from flooding in the past 30 years.

A move was made after a flood in 1953 and effort was renewed af-
