County Agents News Column

The screw worm control program officials are already making plans to extend the sterile fly barrier along the border, according to late reports. The barrier will stretch from below Brownsville to the Arizona-New Mexico state line. If weather permits, and we must emphasize this, the program officials expect the barrier to be in place by February 15, 1963. They expect to use approximately 50 million sterile flies remaining production to fight outbreaks if and when they occur.

The program officials urge us to continue to keep close watch for screwworms and treat any cases that develop. Also, to continue sending in samples.

Both of the above suggestions will be extremely important to us if the program goes as planned. First, we must control any outbreaks that may occur above the barrier if the program is to be a success. If we can keep a case of screwworms from completing its cycle, then we have greatly helped the cause - the outbreak area will be confined and the number of possible cases will be small instead of possibly thous-

Federal Land Bank Lowers Interest

The Federal Land Bank Houston has announced that effective on Jan. 1, 1963, it will reduce temporarily to 5% the interest rate on all outstanding loans which presently bear a rate in excess of 5%. The contract rate on new loans will continue to be 51/2% but interest on loans closed on and after Dec. 1, 1962, will be billed temporarily at 5% until further notice by the bank.

In making the announcement. Hal Weatherford, president of the bank, said that of its \$260 million of loans outstanding more than \$100 million bear contract rates in excess of 5% and that the savings to Texas farmers and ranchers by this action will be more than a half million dollars in the year 1963 alone. Weatherford said this is the fourth time the bank has voluntarily reduced the in-

terest on its outstanding loans. The Houston bank makes longfarm and ranch loans through 73 Federal Land Bank Associations located throughout Texas. Over a five-year period from 1957 through 1961, Bronte property owners paid a total of \$61,730 for premiums and received payments on losses which totaled \$56,948.

The new rate was set after board examiners made "charges" for fire hazards, and applied "credits" for preventive technique.

A charge of 50 cents was levied against a water works which is not recognized by the insurance board; 30 cents against a fire department which is not recognized; 7 cents against the absence of building laws, and 6 cents for other hazardous conditions in mercantile and residential sections.

The total of 93 cents in charges was reduced to 90 cents after a 3-cent credit was allowed for methods of fire prevention taught in public schools.




