Oil Discovery South of Town

Prospects for a new oil field in the Bronte area looked good Wednesday morning when 60 feet of free oil and 245 feet of fluid were recovered on a drillstem test. The

prospector is Karl Hoblitzelle No. 1 Bridges, located southeast of Bronte just across the river.

The test was run on the Crosscut section from 4,404-4,420 feet.

Included in the 245 feet of fluid besides the 60 feet of free oil were 155 feet of mud cut oil and 30 feet of heavily oil cut mud. The test is located a short distance from Ashmund & Hilliard No. 1 Bridges, a failure drilled several years ago.

Hoblitzelle has been doing considerable leasing during the last few months in the Bronte vicinity, and according to latest reports, more tests are planned.

PO to Open Short Time on Dec. 26

Postmaster Noah Pruitt Jr. said early this week that Bronte Post Office will be closed all day Dec. 25, and will be open for only a limited time Saturday, Dec. 26.

A directive from the post office department instructed that rural routes shall be run on the day after Christmas, but said that window service may be limited.

Pruitt said window service will be available for not more than two hours, and that it will be limited to delivery of mail. No sales of money orders, etc., will be available.

Residents Warned On Traffic, Fire Holiday Dangers

Mayor Royce Lee said Wednesday that he hopes all residents of Bronte will have a happy holiday season, and that no one will be a figure in statistics on holiday traffic fatalities.

Calling attention to the large number of predicted fatalities, the mayor urged all residents of the Bronte area to exercise added precaution during the Christmas season. "Most holiday accidents," he said "are caused by human failure, and if we keep constantly alert and remember the rules of common courtesy, we will be far less likely to be involved in a tragic accident."

Justice of the Peace J. T. Liles also urged compliance with traffic and other laws, saying, "I don't want to have to work during the holidays, and if everyone will observe the law, I won't have to bother with seeing you in court." The judge said he would rather see Bronte citizens spend their money on Christmas presents than on paying traffic fines.

Mayor Lee also urged extreme care in prevention of fires. He pointed out that temporary wiring for decorations, Christmas trees and an abundance of Christmas wrapping are all fire hazards, and everyone should be conscious of the more-than-usual danger.

Public notice of this order shall be given by publication thereof in The Bronte Enterprise, a newspaper of general circulation, published in Coke County, Texas, the publication of this Order being once a week for two consecutive weeks, with the first publication being at least twenty (20) days prior to the election and not more than thirty-five (35) days prior thereto.

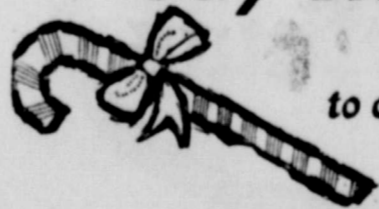

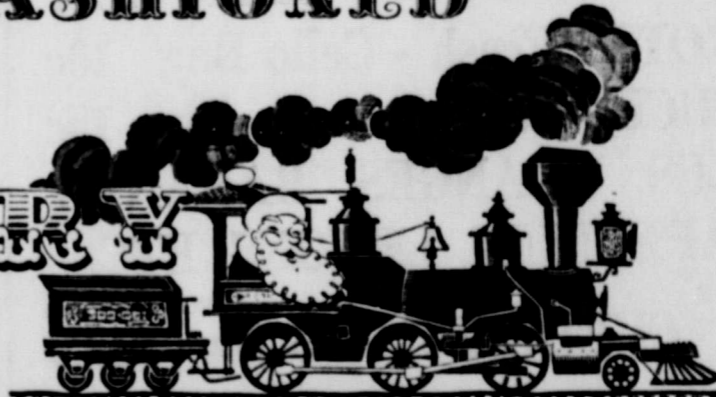
