## Girls in Playoff Friday

A busy weekend of basketball has already begun for the Bronte High School basketball teams. Activity was scheduled to begin Thursday night when the boys game with Forsan was moved up a day because the girls would be playing Friday night with Forsan in a playoff contest at Greenwood. The girls game Friday will start at 7:30 p.m.

The girls won two games during the past week which gave them a tie with Forsan for the championship in the second half of district play. If they defeat Forsan Friday night they will go back to Greenwood Saturday for a 7:30 p.m. game with the Greenwood

The girls have a 29-8 season record and a 5-1 record in the second half of district play.

### Boys Win

The boys hung on to their perfect district record during the

past week and now boast a 10-0. One more win will give them the district championship. They have a 20-7 season record.

In the game last Friday night with Sterling City the Longhorns took a 49-42 win. Jim Dan Raughton was high pointer with 21; Nelson Coulter hit for 12; Kit Carlton 8; Allan Barbee 6; Marvin Waldrop 2.

In a game played here Tuesday night it was Bronte 79, Garden City 45. Raughton and Carlton both hit 18 pointers; Barbee had 15; Wayne Alexander 9; Coulter 6; Marvin Ensor and Waldrop 4 each; Andy Eubanks and Bobby Bailey 2 each; Mark Lee 1.

As stated above, the boys were to play Forsan Thursday night and Water Valley will come here Tuesday night to finish the season. Both A and B teams will play with the first game at 6:30 p.m.

The deadline passed Monday for filing for political office and all incumbent county officials who are up for re-election were able to breathe a sign of relief. No candidates filed against any of them. Only contests are in precinct races on the east side of the county.

Those running for county offices unopposed are County Judge W. W. Thetford, County Sheriff Doug

Robertson, County Clerk Mrs. Winnie Waldrop and County Treasurer Mrs. Jerry Thomason.

Commissioner races have developed in Precincts 2 and 4, with two candidates in each. Bobby Vaughn and Billy Joe Lockett are seeking the Precinct 2 position now held by Jesse Parker who is not running for re-election. In Precinct 4, incumbent Jack Corley is opposed by Jerry Parker.

Precinct 2 Justice of the Peace Cecil Kemp also has an opponent in Mrs. Josie Craig of Blackwell who filed Monday.

Precinct 1 Justice of the Peace Roy P. Ross is running for re-election without an opponent.

One of the hottest races in which Coke Countians are interested is for the seat of Congressman O. C. Fisher, who is not running. A total of 11 candidates, with a good mixture of Democrats and Republicans, are seeking the post.

## Last Rites Held For John E. Scott

Funeral for John E. Scott, 88, of Denton Valley were held Saturday afternoon in Elliott-Hamil Chapel of Memories in Abilene. He was the father of Jake Scott of Bronte.

Mr. Scott died Thursday of last week after a long illness.

Officiating at the funeral was the Rev. Wendell Leach, pastor of Fair Park United Methodist Church, assisted by the Rev. Charles Casey, pastor of Eula Baptist Church. Burial was in Dudley Cemetery.

Born Sept. 13, 1885 in Denton Valley, Mr. Scott had lived and farmed there all his life. He was married to Ora Mae Simmons there on Jan. 6, 1907. She died in 1968.

Mr. Scott was a charter member of the Denton Valley United Methodist Church, which he served as a member of the board of stewards for more than 30 years.

Survivors are four daughters, Mrs. Alvin Grantham of Oplin, Mrs. Carl Cody of Abilene, Mrs. Aidel Turner of Tripoli, Libya; and Mrs. Eddie Blair of Dudley; three sons, Herman Scott of Abilene, J. E. (Jake) Scott of Bronte and Dale Scott of Tripoli, Libya; two sisters, Mrs. J. E. Ogle of Abilene and Mrs. W. L. Loper of Dudley; 18 grandchildren and 25 great-grandchildren.

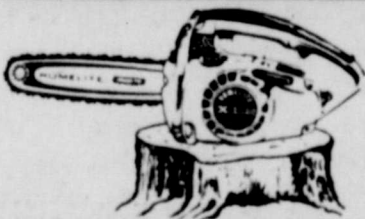
