McCutchen Makes All-American Team

Keith McCutchen, senior at Angelo State University and son of Mr. and Mrs. Luther McCutchen of Bronte, gained an All America spot and was second medalist in the NAIA National Golf Tournament held June 4, 5 and 6 at Aberdeen, S. D. McCutchen was bested by Dan Frickey of Washburn, who had a 294 score, compared to McCutchen's 295.

David Clark, son of Mr. and Mrs. L. O. Clark, has received his degree from Amarillo College Biomedical School in respiratory therapy and has assumed duties as assistant chief, respiratory therapy, at Amarillo Northwest Hospital. He completed four years study in psychology at the University of Texas at El Paso before entering the new field.

Ron Clark, also a son of Mr. and Mrs. L. O. Clark, has been accepted at Parkland Hospital in Dallas to attend one year's training as supervisor chaplain. He will be on leave of absence from the Northwest Hospital and Psychiatric Pavilion of the Amarillo Hospital District as the present chaplain for those facilities.

Ron Clark holds a bachelor's degree from Texas Christian University, and bachelor and master of divinity degrees from TCU Brite Divinity School in pastoral care. He underwent clinical pastoral education at Austin State Hospital for one year and six months at the High Plains Baptist Hospital.

Ron has completed four years as minister for the First Christian Church at Lucas and Albany during the process of completing his college requirements. He considers himself part of the healing team aimed at total care of the hospital patient.

Upon completion of the year of training at Parkland he will have received all the graduate study training in the field of hospital chaplain.

Funeral services for the Rev. R. Russell Heaner, 58, were held at 10 a.m. Wednesday in Bronte First United Methodist Church, where he had been pastor for the past two years. The Rev. Charles L. Giesler, district superintendent of the San Angelo District of the Methodist Church, officiated.

Burial was at 10 a.m. Thursday in Victoria. Newby Funeral Home was in charge of arrangements.

The Rev. Mr. Heaner was found dead at his home about 10 p.m. Monday. His family was out of town and he was scheduled to go to annual conference in San Antonio Monday. Justice of the Peace Cecil Kemp ruled death was from natural causes.

Mr. Heaner was born June 1, 1916, in Victoria. He was married to Dorothy Bearden June 17, 1952, in Tyler. He was a Mason, Rotarian and member of the Noon Lions Club. He was assigned to another year as local pastor the first of this week.

Survivors include his wife, one daughter, Sarah Heaner of the home; one son, John Heaner of the home; two brothers, Terrell W. Heaner of San Antonio and Wallace E. Heaner of Baytown.

Pallbearers were Ed Nunnally of San Angelo, Louis Thornton of Bronte, Jerry Church and James Connel of Blackwell, Robert Vaughan of Robert Lee and Louis White of Ballinger.

Honorary pallbearers were members of the board of trustees and the administrative board of the Bronte Methodist Church, and ministers of the Southwest Texas Conference.

ANOTHER PAPER SAVER

Citizens living east of Washington (Church) Street must do their watering on MWF, while those who live west of Washington must water on TTS. No one is supposed to water on Sunday, thus allowing time to get all storage facilities refilled.

The city has no water shortage, only a lack of pumping capacity to move the water from Oak Creek Lake to the treatment plant. Plans are being made now to install a booster pump in the line between here and the lake.

Bronte Men Given Driving Awards

The Texas Highway Department has awarded certificates to drivers of department vehicles who have been accident free during the past year. Seven employees in Bronte received their certificates from D. R. Watson, district engineer.

To be eligible for the award the operator of a department vehicle must have been free from accidental injury to himself or passengers, damage to his vehicle or cargo, or other vehicles and property.

The awards were as follows: Gilbert Basquez, 15 years; Robert Reyes, 5 years; Julio Galvan Jr. and John McClure Jr., 4 years; Ronald Sowell, 3 years; Audrell Littlefield, 2 years; and Gary Bibeby, 1 year.

These men work under the supervision of J. B. Annot, maintenance construction supervisor.

Prior to 1971, the safe driving awards were issued only to drivers of trucks that were two ton or larger. However, in order to recognize the other safe drivers, the rules were changed so that, beginning in 1971, all drivers would be eligible. This is reflected in the great number of persons receiving 3 year awards throughout the state. Some of these drivers have more years of safe driving, but just the years since 1971 are eligible toward the awards.

The Texas Highway Department realizes its responsibilities to its employees and the general public, a spokesman said, and trains its personnel in the safe operation of vehicles, machinery and tools. The department has a regular safety training and inspection program.

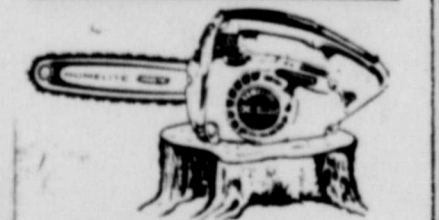
