The Bronte High girls basketball team took the championship trophy at the Roseoe tournament last weekend and the Longhorn team took second place honors in the boys division, in their first action of the season.

Bronte provided most valuable players in both boys and girls divisions of the tourney. Sherrie Coalson received the honor for the girls and Jim Dan Raughton for the boys. Fern Cooper was also named to the girls all-tournament team.

In the girls semi-finals, Bronte sneaked by Lorraine 50-47. Coalson was high pointer with a big 32. The championship final contest was a real thriller, with the local girls squeaking by Hawley 47-46. Again Coalson was high with 23.

### Boys Division

The Longhorns had an easy win of 74-43 over Westbrook in their first game of the tournament on Friday afternoon. Wayne Alexander and Raughton tied for scoring honors with 14 each; Alan Barbee and Nelson Coulter both had 12; Wayne Coalson 8; Kit Carlton 7; Marvin Ensor 5; Randy Leigh 1; Johnny Hibbs 1.

In their semi-finals game Saturday morning with Roseoe, the Bronte lads won 37-30. Raughton was the big gun with 16 points; Alexander and Carlton both hit for 8 and Coulter made 5.

In the finals, Hawley outdid the Horns 37-32 in a low scoring contest. Barbee led scoring for the Bronte team with 11; Coulter hit 7; Alexander 6; Raughton 6; Carlton 2.

Both boys and girls teams lost one point decisions to Wall in games played here Tuesday night. The Longhorns dropped a 33-32 thriller and the girls were beaten 47-46.

# Guaranteed Loans Approved for Coke

The Farmers Home Administration is now taking applications for guaranteed loans for farmers and ranchmen who suffered losses due to the drought of last spring and summer. Coke County has been approved for this type loan.

E. F. Glenn, president of First National Bank in Bronte, said any farmer or ranchman who is eligible should take advantage of the guarantee offered by this federal agency. FHA will guarantee up to 80 per cent of loans made because of the drought.

Glenn said the bank can more liberally serve the loan needs of customers who have applied for and received a guarantee from FHA. "The 80 per cent guarantee will make it a lot easier for

us to give good terms and liberal repay time to farmers and ranchmen who borrow from us," Glenn said.

Up to three years to repay approved loans is allowed by the new law, which was enacted in January 1974. Also, a two year extension is possible under the law.

Glenn invited customers of the First National Bank to come in and discuss the matters with bank officers. They will be glad to answer questions and assist with making applications. Glenn said those interested in securing a loan guarantee should make application in the near future, as the deadline is in January.

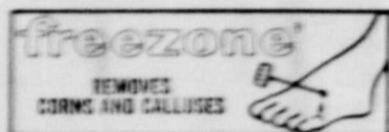

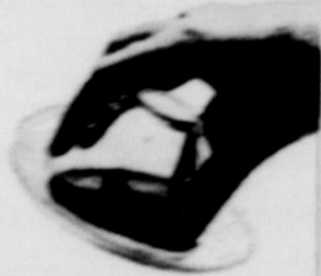

### YOU ARE WHAT YOU EAT

(Editor's note: This is the second in a series of articles submitted by the Coke County Committee on Aging with the hope that it will enlighten both elderly and younger persons on the importance of proper nutrition.)

Food is the basis of life. It is the source of health and well-being, gives you the energy you need for everyday living, affects your weight and height and even your strength to a great extent.

In other words, everything in life begins with food and there is much to the saying, "You are what you eat."

Food contains protein, carbohydrates, fats, vitamins, minerals and water. All of these are nutrients; that is, they nourish the body.

Since food is vital, you need to know about the nutritive content of foods, which ones are the best sources of the various nutrients, and how to combine them into a healthful, balanced diet.

The important thing is to remember that no one food does everything and all foods have something to offer. A variety of different types of foods will provide all the nutrients most of us need.

Water is a most important nutrient. Water stands next to air in importance to life. You can get along for days, even weeks, without food but only a few days without water.

Water is necessary for all the processes of digestion. Nutrients are dissolved in water so they may pass through the intestinal wall and into the blood stream for use throughout the body. Water carries waste out of the body and also helps to regulate body temperature.

The body's most obvious

source of water is the water a person drinks, but some is produced by the body's burning of food for energy. Coffee and tea are mostly water, and so are fruit juices and milk. Soup is a water source and so are many fruits and vegetables. Even meat can be up to 80 per cent water.

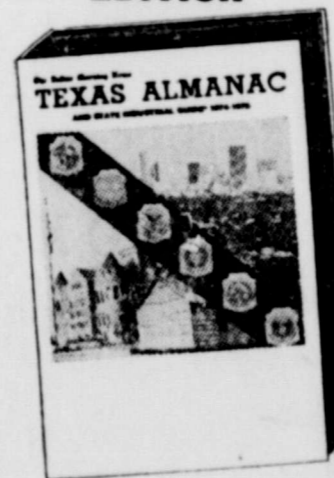

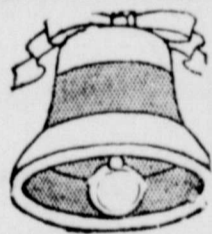

### REGISTRATION STILL REQUIRED OF 18 YEAR OLDS

Young men are reminded of their obligation to register with Selective Service within 30 days of their 18th birthday. If, for any reason, a young man has failed to register, he should do so immediately to escape the penalty of federal law.

The draft has ended and can begin again only after the Congress grants authority for induction, but the requirement to register with Selective Service is still a part of the existing federal law.

Registrars are available at all county courthouses, National Guard armories and in most high schools, to assist young men in completing their registration obligation. The Selective Service area office in San Angelo, located in the 7 W. Twohig Bldg., is also open from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. to assist young men with registration and Selective Service matters.
