The Bronte Longhorn girls basketball team and Coach Zula Sweeten, left Thursday morning for Stephenville where they will be participating in the regional UIL tournament this week. Opening game for the local girls will be at 4:30 Friday afternoon when they take on Midway of Henrietta. The game will be played in the new gym on the campus of Tarleton State University.

A win Friday afternoon over Midway would place the locals in the semi-finals Saturday morning. That game will be played at 10 a.m. against the winner of the Brock-May game. Finals at the tournament will be played Saturday night with a third place game at 6:30 and the championship tilt set for 8 p.m. Winner of the regional meet will advance on to Austin and the state tournament.

Other teams at the region are Lipan, Godley, Priddy and Throckmorton. Brock is the No. 2 ranked

team in the state while Priddy is 10th and Midway is 13th.

Miss Hite took her blue ribbon with "Pineapple Refrigerator Pie" in the breads and dessert class.

Other Coke County 4-H'ers winning blue ribbons in the junior food division were Dee Anna Key of Robert Lee with her "Pumpkin Bread" in the snacks and beverage class; Lisa Lee of Bronte with "Tostado Pizza" in the main dish class; and Jo Ella Forehand of Bronte with "Strawberry Salad" in the side dish class. Golson, Raughton Contracts Extended

Two important items of business were taken care of at the last meeting of the board of trustees of the Bronte School. Contracts of High School Prin. James L. Golson and Elementary School Prin. James M. Raughton were extended for one year and the board called an election for voters to decide on three trustees on April 5.

The year's extension to the principals' contracts make them run until Aug. 31, 1977.

Three trustees are to be elected in April. Terms of Dale Thompson and Delbert Coalson will expire after three years of service from the two gentlemen. Also, the term of Grady Louis Coulter expires, as he was appointed to fill the unexpired term of James Arnold Tidwell who resigned.

Candidates for trustee may file in one of two ways: they may file their own candidacies or they may be petitioned by citizens of the district. Either process has to be done in the office of Supt. C. B. Barbee who has all the proper forms for filing. Barbee brought out a new matter of state law which requires that every candidate for trustee has to list a campaign manager when he files for a spot on the ballot.

ORDINANCE CALLING SPECIAL ELECTION FOR ADOPTION OF LOCAL SALES TAX WHERE PAPER BALLOTS ARE USED

AN ORDINANCE ORDERING A SPECIAL ELECTION TO BE HELD IN THE CITY OF BRONTE, TEXAS, ON THE QUESTION OF THE ADOPTION OF A ONE PERCENT (1%) LOCAL SALES AND USE TAX WITHIN THE CITY; DESIGNATING THE DAY OF ELECTION AND THE POLLING PLACE; APPOINTING ELECTION OFFICIALS THEREFOR; PROVIDING THAT ALL DULY QUALIFIED RESIDENT ELECTORS SHALL BE QUALIFIED TO VOTE; PRESCRIBING FORM OF BALLOT; PROVIDING FOR NOTICE OF ELECTION; CONTAINING OTHER PROVISIONS RELATING TO SAID ELECTION; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, Article 1066c, Vernon's Texas Civil Statutes (Acts 1967, 60th Legislature, Regular Session, Chapter 36, Page 62) authorizes the governing body of any city, town or village in Texas to call an election for the purpose of adopting a local sales and use tax within such city, town or village; Now Therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BRONTE:

Section 1. That a special election shall be held in and throughout the City of Bronte, Texas, on the 5th day of April, 1975, at which election there shall be submitted to the resident qualified voters of said City, for their action thereupon, the following propositions:

"FOR adoption of a one percent (1%) local sales and use tax within the city."

"AGAINST adoption of a one percent (1%) local sales and use tax within the city."

Section 2. That said election shall be held at one polling place for all qualified voters of said City, and the polling place and presiding officers for said election shall be, to-wit:

Polling Place: Bronte City Hall
Presiding Officers: Mrs. Willie B. Millikin, Presiding Judge; Mrs. Tricia Stout, Alternate Presiding Judge.

The Presiding Judge at such election shall appoint two clerks.

Section 3. That said election shall be held in accordance with the Constitution and laws of the State of Texas, and all duly qualified resident electors of the City of Bronte, Texas, shall be qualified to vote.

Section 4. That the ballots of said election shall conform to the requirements of Section 2, Subsection G, of Article 1066c, Vernon's Texas Civil Statutes (Acts 1967, 60th Legislature, Regular Session, Chapter 36, Page 62), and to the requirements of Chapter 6 of the Election Code of the State of Texas, as amended, and the language to be printed thereon shall include the following:

OFFICIAL BALLOT

INSTRUCTIONS: Place an "X" in the square beside the statement indicating the way you wish to vote.

FOR adoption of a one percent (1%) local sales and use tax within the city.

AGAINST adoption of a one percent (1%) local sales and use tax within the city.

Section 5. That election judge and clerks are directed to comply with Article 6.06, Election Code of the State of Texas, as amended (Section 2 of House Bill 181, Acts 1967, 60th Legislature, Regular Session, Chapter 452, Pages 1026, 1028), which provides that a square shall be placed beside each proposition in which the voter is instructed to place an "X" or other clear mark to indicate the way he wishes to vote; but which also provides that failure of a voter to mark his ballot in strict conformity with the directions on the ballot shall not invalidate the ballot, and the ballot shall be counted if the intention of the voter is

clearly ascertainable, except where the law expressly prohibits the counting of the ballot. It is specifically provided that the election officers shall not refuse to count a ballot because of the voter's having marked his ballot by scratching out the statement of proposition for which he does not wish to vote.

Section 6. That notice of the election hereby ordered and called shall be given: (a) by publication on the same day of two successive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation published within said city, the date of the first publication to be at least twenty-one (21) days prior to the date set herein for such election; and (b) by posting of such notice at the polling place in each of the election precincts of the city not less than twenty (20) days prior to the date set herein for such election. It is hereby found and determined that The Bronte Enterprise is a newspaper published with the City of Bronte, Texas, and is a newspaper of general circulation

within said city.


