

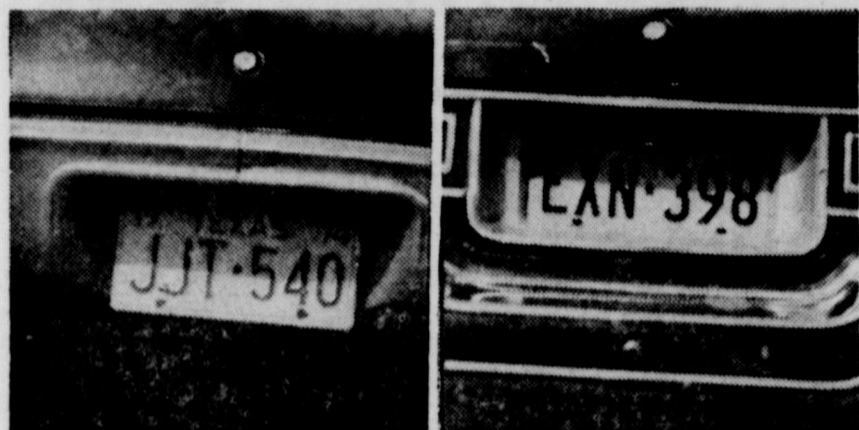

Deadline Nears for Purchasing New Tags

"Are you plated or belated?" That's the question motorists may be facing after midnight, April 1, deadline for motor vehicle registration in Texas. After that time, law enforcement agencies have been instructed to stop motorists not displaying the 1975 plates to remind them of their licensing responsibilities.

Local Girls Invited To Brownie Camp

A Brownie Day at Camp Boothe Oaks, south of Sweetwater, has been scheduled for May 3 from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. Mrs. Marie Graham of Roscoe, chairman of the Revel, extends an invitation to all Brownie Girl Scouts and their leaders from Roscoe, Sweetwater, Rotan, Colorado City, Loraine, Robert Lee, Bronte, Blackwell and Roby.

The Brownie Revel will offer the girls an opportunity to enjoy a day outdoors while visiting the established camp of the West Texas Girl Scout Council. They will see how older Girl Scouts go troop camping,

well as offices in the other 253 counties of Texas have been conducting car tag sales. Early reports indicate the annual procedure, required of the states 9.2 million motor vehicle owners, is running smoothly. However, many owners traditionally wait until the "last minute" to react, resulting in longer lines and delays.

According to a Highway Department spokesman, public response to the new five year license plate, being issued for the first time in Texas, has been good. In fact, motorists have shown an uncommon interest in the "label" their motor vehicles will wear through 1979.

Instead of annual replacement, motorists will be issued an adhesive type sticker beginning in 1976, that will update their plates for another year of driving. The sticker will be placed in the unembossed upper left corner of the plate. The following year, the tag will be stuck in the upper right corner to cover the "75", and alternated for the ensuing years. Once in place, the tags cannot be easily removed with deterioration, a part of the plan to discourage vandalism or theft.

County tax offices will continue to issue annual plates to certain classes of motor vehicles. These include radio operators, dealers, government officials and those passenger cars displaying "personalized" plates.

Jacobs said his office will continue selling the new car tags through the regular closing time Monday, March 31.

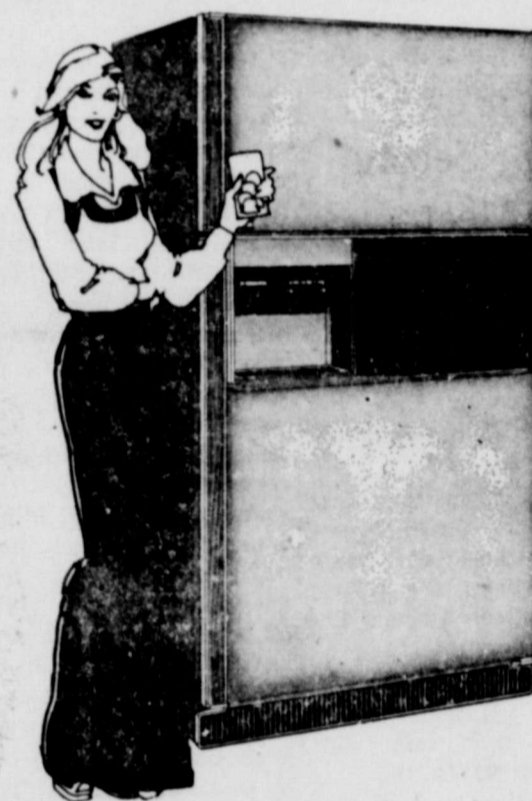

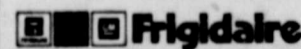

OIL NEWS

Mann-Rankin of Midland has re-scheduled to 7,000 feet its No. 1 Lasser, a 5,600 foot wildcat two miles northwest of Sanco. The test is a northwest twin to the second well in the Benito (Strawn) Field and is 1 1/2 miles south-southwest of the Arledge (Pennsylvanian) field.

Location is 2,173 feet from the south and 990 feet from the east lines of Section 308, Block 1A, H&TC Survey.

Grandsons served as pallbearers.

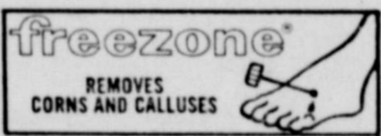

Refreshments of punch, finger sandwiches, cookies and mints were served from a tea table decorated with spring flowers as a centerpiece.

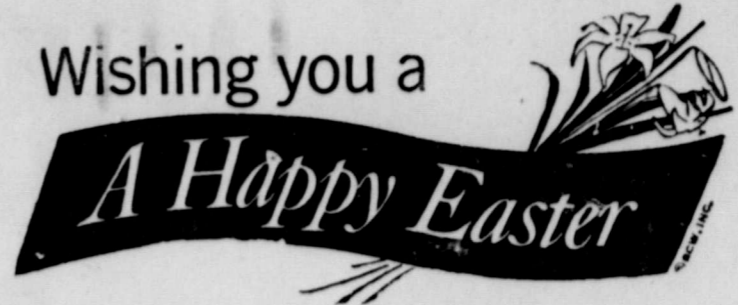

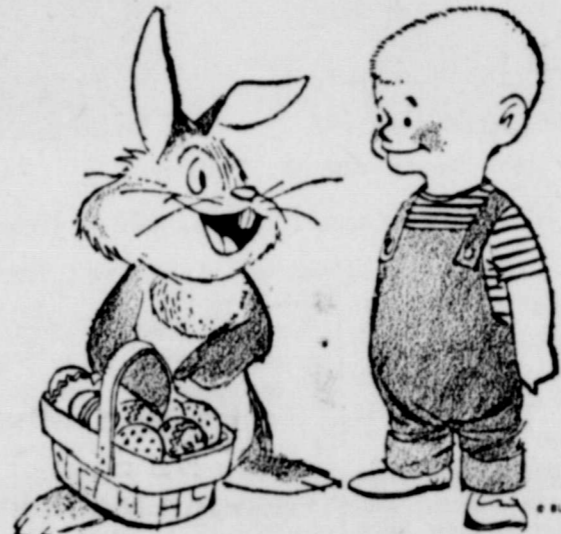

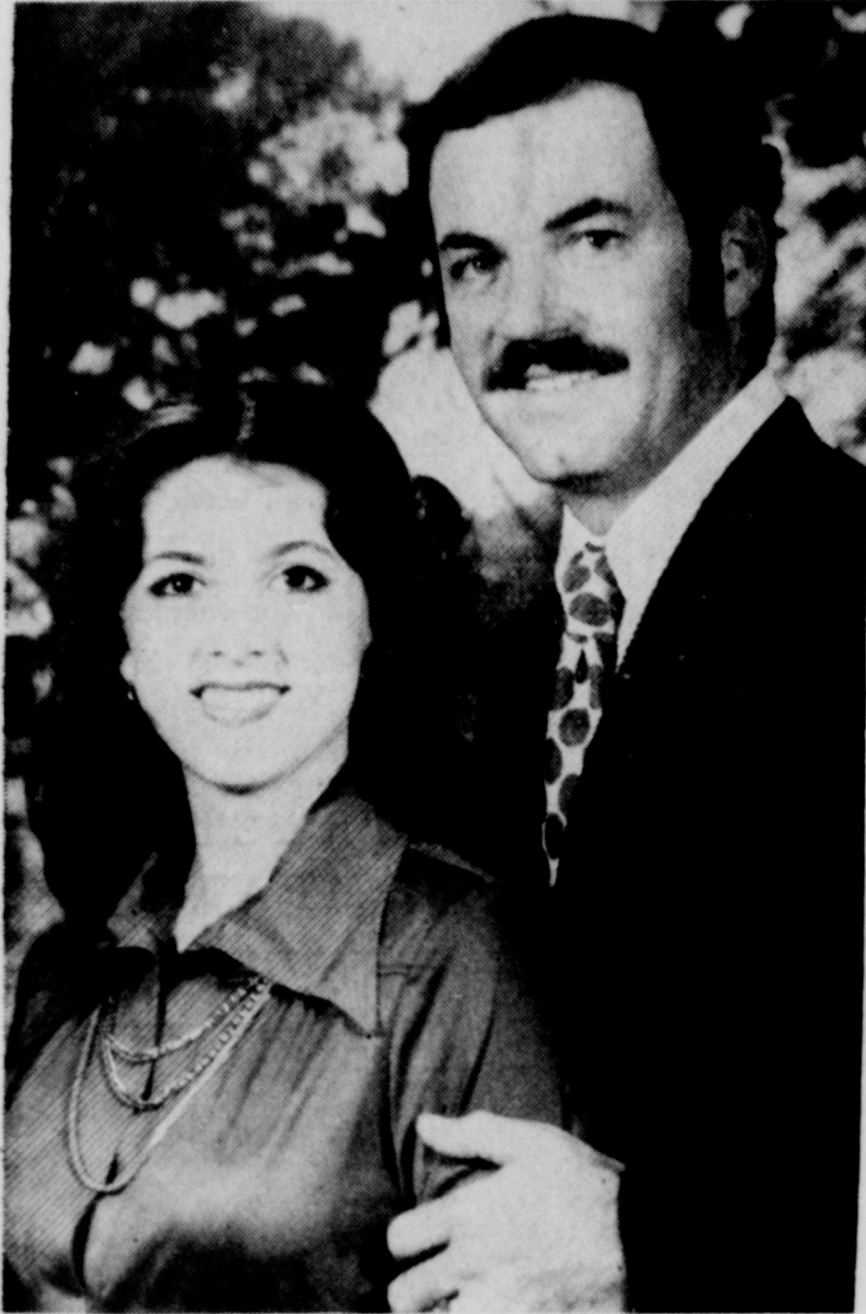
