Longhorn Golf Team Class B State Champions

The Bronte Longhorn golf team are the 1975 Class B State Champions. The local boys captured the title last weekend when the state tourney was held at rain soaked Jimmy Clay Municipal Golf Course in Austin. The Horns' two day total of 700 was eight strokes below Roby's runnerup total of 708. Defending state champion Booker finished third with 731. James M. "Stickie" Raughton is the Longhorns' coach.

The Longhorns took a four stroke lead at the end of the first round played Friday, shooting a 347 to Roby's 351. Then on the Saturday, the Horns fired a 353 to Roby's 357.

Both rounds were played under poor conditions on a course which was completely drenched with rain.

Wayne Alexander had an 84-85-169 to lead the Longhorns while finishing third in individual medalist play. Ricky Faught and Randy King, both of Roby, finished for first with 164 scores, with Faught taking the title in a playoff. This was the third straight year for Alexander to compete at the state level. He finished second in both his sophomore and junior years. The Longhorn team also finished second in 1973.

Wayne Coalson fired an 86-86-172 to finish in fifth place in individual

play. He was followed by Jim Dan Raughton who shot an 85-92-177 also to finish high in the medalist play. Randy Parker had a 92-90-182 while Bobby Bailey shot 94-95-190. The four low scores are used as team total.

Alexander, Raughton and Bailey are seniors while Coalson is a sophomore and Parker is a freshman.

Second State Title

This was the second state golf title for a Longhorn team in recent years. The 1969 team composed of Keith McCutchen, Ronald Cooper, Steve Williams, Monico Flores and Otis Rolls, also captured the coveted title. Clint Low was their coach.

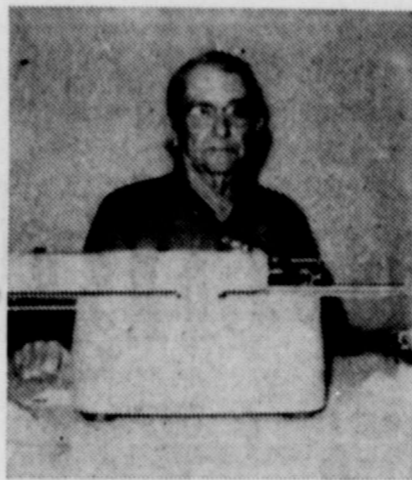

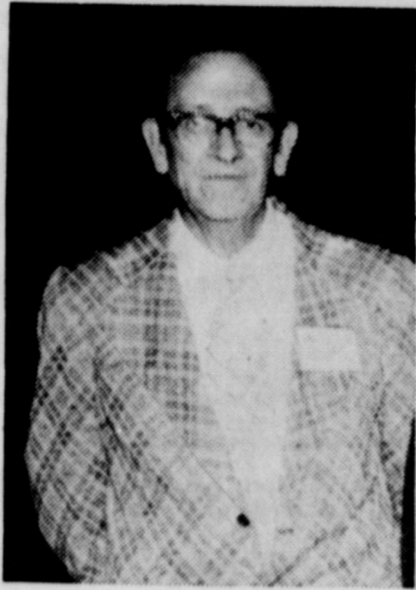
ELEMENTARY INTRAMURAL TRACK MEET MONDAY

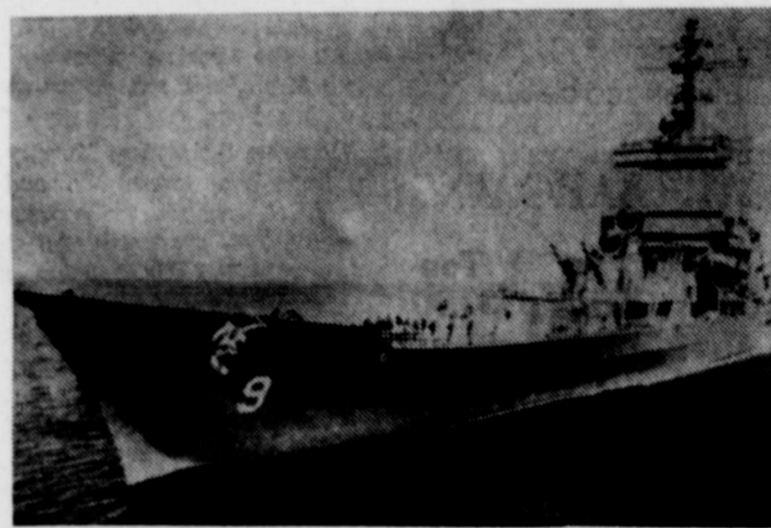
