discuss possible lawsuit

Dimmitt's Board of Aldermen spent more than half their Monday night meeting in executive session, to reportedly discuss the annual auditor's report and the possibility of a lawsuit being filed by Larry and Cheryl Caldwell, owners of a kennel which was found to be in violation of city zoning ordinances.

The Caldwells were originally granted a zoning permit from police chief Ron Mitchell, who understood they planned to keep only a few puppies "temporarily." When the Caldwells decided later to open the kennel, the board ruled their permit invalid, claiming that it violated existing city ordinances.

An attorney retained by the Caldwells told the board they would file suit unless a sum totaling \$2,600 is reimbursed for expenses incurred in the closing of the kennel. The board tabled discussion on the matter until additional word is received from the Caldwells or their lawyer.

Also Monday night, the board met with representatives from Brown, Graham and Co., the firm that prepared this year's city audit.

After the lengthy private session with the auditors, Mayor Elmer Youts said, "We discussed the internal control of city finances and now have a better understanding of the internal affairs of collections and expenses so that we can better advise people.'

The board also heard a request for an increase in salary from Judge L. G. 'Shorty' Manning. The salary was not adjusted with the salaries of other city employees in May because he was classified as an elected official. decided in executive session to adjust the Judge's salary, since the board had always set the salary.

Tax increase hearing set

A public hearing on the proposed county tax increase will be held Monday night at 5 p.m. in the county court- 24 hou room at the Castro County Courthouse.

The proposed increase will raise the county ad valorem tax by 22.4 percent and increase the county road tax by 87.5 percent.

County commissioners will be at the session to answer questions from county residents and to hear their views on the proposal.

\$7,200 a year, and will be increased to \$8,700 a year, as of May 1, 1980 when all other salaries were fixed.

Judge Manning has collected \$43,971.75 in fines and fees this past year, Mayor Youts said.

In regular session, city attorney Jack Edwards reported on the Census Bureau's latest estimates for the City of Dimmitt. He said that the labor camp had been included in the original figure of almost 4,900.

"The biggest problem is in the 266 'no responses' that the Bureau reported. They have actual addresses for these homes, and they are either vacant or didn't respond. This is abnormally high and way above average according to the Bureau estimates. Probably more than half of this number just didn't respond," Edwards said.

He said that the Bureau will re-work this area and try to get more response on the second time out. The board suggested that a Dimmitt resident go with the representative from the Census Bureau to help increase the response.



The Veterans Land Board, June 30, 1980, sold 66 million dollars in bonds, permitting resumption of the land program. July 11, 1980, the Board set the interest on loans at seven (7%) percent, effective immediately. The interest rate for transfers of existing loans to non-veterans has been set at eight and one-half (81/2 %) percent.

The Board will resume the mailing of application materials by July 18.

To apply, a fee of \$10 must be sent to secure the application materials. Upon receipt of the material, the Texas Veteran has 90 days to complete the arrangement to purchase an approved minimum of 10 acres of Texas


