Board Reviews Audit of School Books

Bronte School's board of trustees met Nov. 13 in regular session and the main item of business was a discussion of the annual audit with representatives of the Harold B. Simpson Co. of Austin.

GLENN ATTENDS BANKING SEMINAR

Earl F. Glenn has just returned from a seminar cosponsored by the Government Relations Council of the American Bankers Association (ABA) and the Office of the U. S. Comptroller of the Currency.

Glenn, president of First National Bank in Bronte, met at Lake Travis in Austin on Nov. 20-22 with other national bank executive officers and Comptroller James E. Smith and senior officials of his office.

Ninth in a series of regional seminars, discussions covered such topics as the nation's economy, trends in bank examination, holding company expansion, branching, trust developments and legal and antitrust matters. Question and answer periods and informal dialogue between the CEOs and the Comptroller highlighted the seminar.

The ABA is the national association of the banking industry. Its membership comprises nearly 14,000 banks—more than 95 per cent of the nation's total.

BRONTE FFA WINS HONORS AT DISTRICT

The Bronte FFA Chapter participated Wednesday, Nov. 19, in the District FFA Leadership Contest which was held at San Angelo Central High School.

The chapter won second places honors in the Junior Chapter Conducting Contest. This contest is designed for first year vocational agriculture students and involves fundamental skills in parliamentary procedure.

Officials Make Trip to Capital

The Texas Association of Counties chartered a plane to carry county officials to Washington, D. C. early last week. Judge W. W. Thetford and Commissioner Jerry Parker represented Coke County.

The purpose of the special delegation was to meet with the Ways and Means Committee to see how Revenue Sharing is going to be issued for the year 1977.

The Coke County delegates came back hopeful that Coke County would receive its allotted portion of Revenue Sharing funds.

Judge Thetford said that the delegation was well received in Washington added that both Texas senators are for continuing the program. He said Congressman Bob Krueger and President Ford also are in favor of the sharing plan.

Last year Coke County received approximately \$67,000 through the Revenue Sharing program, and the Cities of Bronte and Robert Lee also received sufficient funds to allow them to keep their pre-inflation tax rates in force.

Judge Thetford said, "We had a good reception and I think the meeting was very successful."

Thetford and Parker came back to Texas Tuesday night of last week.

Texas had the largest delegation at the gathering with 250 of the total delegation of 1,200.

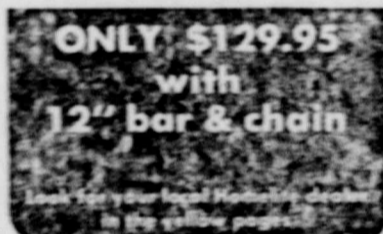
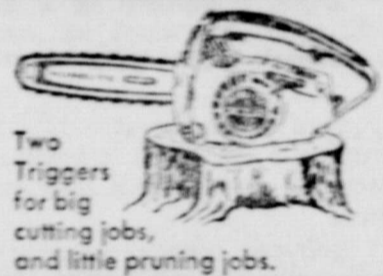
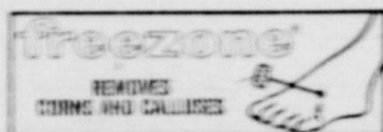
