School Evaluation Program Planned By Community

The community school concept is returning. "The school belongs to the community. Local control is to be honored," Supt. C. B. Barbee said at the recent Public School Week sponsored by the Masonic Lodge. "We hope to prove that education in Bronte Schools is quality education."

The Bronte Public Schools have been selected to participate in the Self-Evaluation School Accreditation Planning Process Project during the 1976-77 school year.

In a meeting March 2, Ann Jones, consultant for the Region XV Education Service Center, presented an overview of the project and procedures to the steering committee. The committee, composed of school administrators and representatives from the school board, faculty, student body, and community citizens, will establish goals for education in the Bronte School District, lead the district in self-study, and develop a plan for meeting the established goals.

Prin. James L. Golson expressed his enthusiasm about the program. "This is an opportunity for the local community to reinforce control in what goes on in the school system. It is also an opportunity for those who have opinions and would like to become involved in shaping the educational program." He added that this may be our last opportunity for local control and that if we do not exercise our responsibility here we might lose the opportunity forever.

Some time in April a large number of community, faculty, and students will be given a questionnaire in which they may rank goals in order of their importance. Results will be tabulated and used in school planning. As a result of these samplings, the school's staff will learn of ideas that Bronte citizens have regarding what young people should know or be able to do when they finish school. Based on these goals, the steering committee will determine how the schools are performing in relation to the goals. If there is a gap between "what is" and "what should be," a need area has been identified. The school board and faculty will then determine ways to solve the problem. These ways may involve some changes in materials, teaching strategies, or course offerings.

The projects success depends on the cooperation and participation of Bronte residents. This is an excellent opportunity for each person to view his opinions about what the goals of our school should be.

TRACK TEAMS HAVE GOOD DAY AT ROBY

Bronte High School Longhorns and Elementary School Shorthorns entered a track meet last Saturday at Roby. The Longhorns finished 4th while the Shorthorns were 5th. There were 21 schools entered in each division.

The two Longhorn relay teams again picked up the most team points. The 440 team finished 4th in a time of 46.6, while the milers ran 2nd with a 3:38.6. Robert Ball, Wayne Coalson, Nelson Coulter and Kyle James make up the 440 team while Ball, Coalson, Coulter and Paul Cervenka make up the mile team.

Others scoring points for the Horns were Mario Gonzales with a 3rd in the shot put with a toss of 43' 10"; Coulter a 2nd in the 330 intermediate hurdles in a time of 42.5; and Johnny Hibbs, a 5th in the intermediate hurdles in 44.6.

The Longhorns will participate in a meet at Ballinger Saturday.

Elementary Division

The Shorthorns 440 yard relay team finished 2nd in a time of 52.4, while the 880 team came in 3rd. These two teams are made up of Ken Coalson, Butch Carper, Donnie Hamilton and Mark Ball.

Hamilton made the rest of the Shorthorns' points, finishing 1st in the 60 yard high hurdles, in the high jump and 2nd in the broad jump.

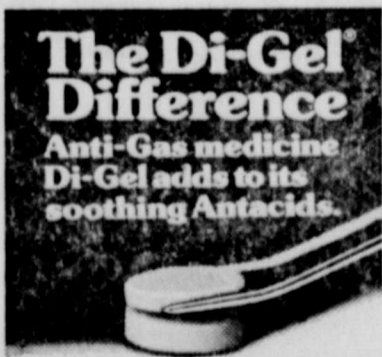

MRS. VEST HONORED ON 75TH BIRTHDAY

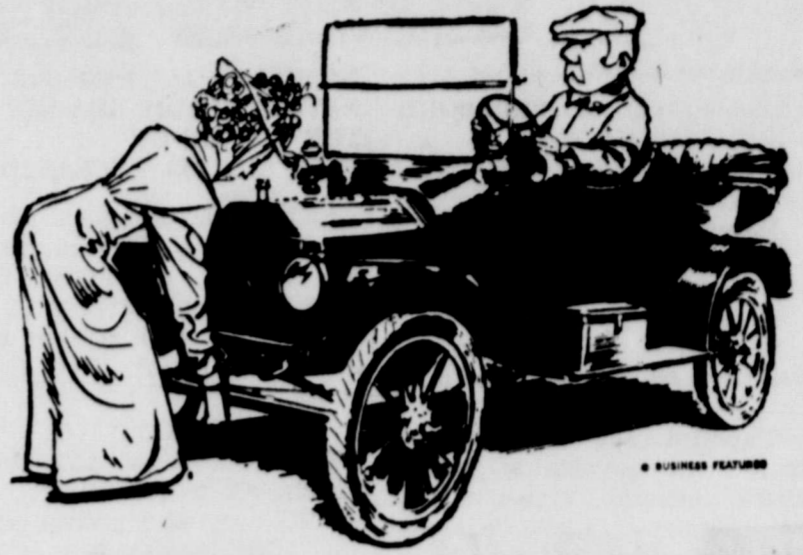

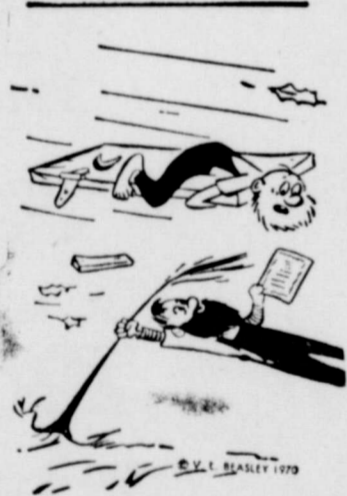
