Please, Bert, dear, come back." <br> CHANGES IN NEW ZEALAND <br> Native Races, Animals and Forests <br> Being Displaced by Importations From Other Lands. <br> More rapid changes in animal and vegetable life are taking place in New Zealand than almost anywhere in the world. The native Polynestan race is disappearing before the European; the native wild animals amount to little in contests with the imported species, many of which now run wild; the streams are full of American and European trout, which attain an enormous size, and even the forests are being replaced by the planting of foreign trees as the native ones disappear. <br> Eleven million larches, oaks, spruces, Douglas firs and eucalyptus have already been planted and vast numbers of seedings are coming in all the time. The reason for replacing the native trees with species from the United States, Europe and Australia is that those of New Zealand are too slow of growth, although some of them produce excellent timber.
