The officers are turning every stone to discover who killed Dillard Clark. A material witness has been discovered in the person of W. O. Asheraft, who fully described the murdered man and also the person whom he saw with Clark near Lindale, in Smith county, on the day Clark was killed. He went to the jail and picked Chapman from among the other prisoners as the man seen with Dillard.
