One purchaser can buy as much as four sections, and two of these may be classified as agricultural lands, and in such cases the purchaser must be an actual settler Under the former law he could buy four grazing sections only, or if he was an actual settler on agri caltura', then he could buy three additional sections.

Under the former law a purchaser had to be a purchaser of agricultural land in order to buy any additional grazing lands, but under the new law if he be a purchaadditional lands, not to include more than two sections of agricultural land altogather. Besides any actual bona fide owner of, or resident upon any lands, which includes lands purchased under certificates or otherwise, may also buy additional lands not more than four surveys, including his residence survey, but in such case he or his vendees must continue his residence on his home survey for three consesutive years after such purchase and make proof of occupancy in order to perfect his title to school land purchases. as in other cases for actual settlers.

With the above three excepttions any lands under lease are subject to sale when the requirements of the act of 1895 as to settlement etc. are complied with, provided that no person can buy additional lands situated more than five miles from his home sur-




