## IAPORTANTAS TO LIN

Land Commissioner A. J. Batier issues the following important let ter callug attention to difference butween the new lay and that of 1895.

Classification-There chauge in cases where classifica tions have never been made ander forme: law. The commissioner is still required to make classifeations "upon such facts as may be hatisfactory to him." But whe he lands have been erroneousi classitied under former laws, th crrors may be corrected noon the offleial certificates of the commis sioners conrt signed by the entire court and coanty judge or apon Fuch other evidence as may be satisfactory to the commissione of the land office. This can onl apply to lands which are on the market and where they may be
forfeited and before being sold
ain.
the smallest sale is eighty aneres multiples thereof not forty ac es, as in former law) excep
where there is unsold or any see on less than eighty acres.
One purchaser can buy as much as four sections, and two of these tany be classified as agricaltural ands, and in such cases the pur chaser must be an actual settle ler the fomer law he could hay four grazing sections only, or it he was an actual settler on age cal ara', then he could buy three aldhtional sections.
Under the former law a purcha se: had to be a parchaser of agricultural land in order to buy any addilional grazing lands, but un der the new law if he be a parcha nutany class of lants he can buy alditional lands, not to include taral land at ogather. Besides any actual bona fide owner of, or resident upou any lands, which inclades lauds purchased under certifi Cites or otherwise, may also buy additional lands not more that four surieys, including his resi ronce surves, bat in such case he or his vehdees mast contina for three consesulice years after hor threc consesince years after ocempancy ia order to lerfect his titte to sciool land purchases. as in other cases for actua! settlers. Cusold agricultural lands mas he sold at bot less than 81.50 and graeing land at not less than \$1.00 and timbered lands at not less that 8.09 per acre. These are liumbar cases, sold high. int it mast be particularly noted has a a rates heretotore mate which are not forfeitahle when this law gets wito offece, if they be in fact agri cultural lands, canaot be repareh ased by the forfeiting parchase at aug lower price than the pric at which they were sold under the former sale.
