## PREDICT BIG CROP.

Twelve Million Six Hundred Thousand Bales Based on Ginnings' Report.

Washington, Nov. 23.—(Special.)

The census bureau bulletin on cotton issued today is regarded as indicating a crop considerably larger than most producers and operators in the South seem to expect. An increase of 43.13 per cent over last year in the amount ginned up to November 14 is shown in the 475 counties, which have reported out of a total of about 812. Up to Nov. 14, last year, 69.4 per cent of the total crop had been ginned. Experts here estimate uniformly that ginning is at least 10 per cent further advanced this year than last and on this basis they figure a total crop of 12,650,045 bales.

Today's report shows that only seventy-one Texas counties have reported to date, active ginnings to the number of 2,026 are indicated in those prior to Nov. 14 as against 2,073 last year. The number of running bales ginned in these seventy-one counties up to Nov. 14, is 1,269,913 bales compared with 907,622 bales for the corresponding period last year.

In the whole of Texas last year 4,412 active ginnings were reported prior to Nov. 14 and 1,32,549 bales were ginned up to that time.

### Western Texas a Garden Spot.

Captain George B. Hendricks of Tom Green county, who is the city on cattle business, is greatly impressed with the prosperous condition of Texas in general and extremely enthusiastic over the productions and possibilities of his own section.

Said Captain Hendricks yesterday to a Record representative: "This is without question the greatest year Texas has ever known agriculturally. Not only have crops of all kinds been good, but cotton notwithstanding the boll weevil still leads, and is leading millions to our wealth."

"Texas is a great state, take it as you will, but I do think that Tom Green, Coleman and Runnels counties form the garden spot of the world. The very fact that land in those counties has doubled in value in the last five years proves that a great many other people think just as I do."

"The low price of cattle seems to be serving the same purpose as the boll weevil, for cattlemen are fast converting their ranches into farms and thereby making even more money. In our section there are not more than three large ranches left."

In answer to the inquiry as to what is raised there, Captain Hendricks said: "Nearly everything, of course cotton is the leading product, but alfalfa, sorghum, kafir, corn and all kinds of feedstuffs grow to perfection and we raise the finest watermelons on earth."

"About the boll weevil? We do not have any. Specimens have been brought there, but they simply will not live. You see our cotton, though very productive, averaging a half bale to the acre, does not grow tall, has very scant foliage and is therefore not sufficiently shaded for the boll weevil to thrive."

"What do you do when the droughts come?"

"The land is so fruitful that if droughts do come we are prepared for them by keeping on hand an abundance of everything from one year to the next. The artesian water there is the finest in the world, since it is free from those elements that make it injurious to vegetable growth. We irrigate some when necessary."

**RAILROAD RUMBLINGS**  
New Reports—Road Coming this Way. Will Another Road Benefit Ballinger.

Under the head of "Railway Building in the Lone Star State, Santa Fe Extension, etc.," we clip the following from the Fort Worth Record of last Sunday: "The fact that the Rockefeller interests have recently acquired a large interest in the Santa Fe is taken by some to mean that it may have a more aggressive spirit in extending its system in Texas and the Southwest. As an evidence of this possible change of policy, E. P. Ripley, president of the Santa Fe, is at the head of the Jasper and Estera Railway Company, which has been organized for the purpose of extending the Gulf, Beaumont and Kansas City division of the Santa Fe from Kirbyville, Texas, to Alexandria, La. This proposed extension will be only seventeen miles in Texas. A party of Santa Fe engineers have been in the field for some time locating a route for a new line which is to be built from Ballinger, on the San Angelo branch of the Santa Fe, to a connection with its Pecos Valley system at Canyon City or Amarillo. This new line will be about 300 miles long and will afford a new and direct route to the port of Galveston from the northwestern part of the State and from points on the Pecos Valley and the Southern Kansas division of the Santa Fe."

Perhaps some of our readers are getting sore on railroad news and have little or no confidence in what they hear, but we feel under obligations to give our readers these reports just as we get them. As to the reliability of the reports, we can not say, and as to the advantage a new road would be to Ballinger, we see very little. It is true another road would give us better traffic facilities; but at the same time it would cut off the trade that Ballinger is now getting. It would cut down our trade territory, and with this done we would be more damaged than advantaged by a new road. What we need to build up Ballinger and Rannels County is more good thirty farmers. We have the land and 500 or 1,000 new homes in Rannels County would benefit the country more than a dozen railroads, according to the writer's idea. However, we enter no protest and will work, as is ever the Ledger's policy, for the interest of our town, county and people.—Rannels County Ledger.
