Houston, Texas, Nov.-The Texas Welfare Commission has completed its labors and reports of the Commission have been published in book form by the Texas Commercial Secretaries and Business Men's Association. The Commission docketed for discussion fifteen subjects and heard fifty-three witnesses and examined a large volume of evidence submitted in writing. The Commission has made its recommendations on twelve-subjects, embracing the important industries of the state. C. Duff of this city

the Commission their views. The Commission recommended legislation on the following subjects:

1st. That all outstanding bonds lawfully issued may be refunded regardless of any valuation fixed upon the property by the Railroad Commission of

2nd. That bonds may be issued for improvement, betterment or extension regardless of

3rd. That bonds may be is sued before, during or after construction, providing a strict accounting is made to the Railroad Commission.

4th. That the sale of bonds by new railroads be authorized in advance of construction, providing safeguards insuring the proper application of the -preceeds.


