





## POPULAR MECHANICS

Horsepower of a Rainfall. Few people realize the energy in a fall of rain. On the evening of Oct. 9. 1914, there fell at Kansas City, Mo., in two hours 1.79 inches of rain. Assuming that this rain covered an area four miles square, or sixteen square miles and that it fell from an altitude of 6,000 feet, the energy represented was about 6,300,000 horsepower hours. Were this converted into electrical energy without the usual losses it would amount to nearly 4,700,000 kilowatt hours. At 10 cents per kilowatt hour this energy would cost \$470,000. Scientific American.

To Test Pocket Watches.

We now have in this country an opportunity to secure an official standard of that commodity sometimes compared to money in the often repeated "time is money," says the Scientific American The bureau of standards, official measurer of the United States, undertakes for a fixed fee ranging from 50 cents to \$5 to report on and certify as to pocket watches. The most elabo rate test, known as Class A, involves the running of the watch for fifty-four days in a series of periods in various positions and at different temperatures.



Lubricating Spring Leaves A new device for the lubrication of the leaves of automobile springs has been brought out, says the Scientific American. The device is essentially nothing but a pair of plates bolted one on each side of the spring. Each plate incloses a small oil reservoir and a feit wick, the latter pressed against the edges of the spring leaves and feeding the oil between.

An Aid to Starting. Take a small bottle or tin with a little gasoline in it and place it for a few minutes in hot water, until the gasoline is hot, then place a few drops of the hot gasoline in the compression tap and inject into the cylinder. This method has been a help to starting. It may be useful to know this, as there is no possible danger with it.


Much has been said and more writ ten about the evils of watered stock in big business concerns and the farmers of this nation believe that every dollar written into the life of any business organization, should be able liveth," but farming is the biggest business on earth, and there is more water in its financial transaction than as much water in a farmer's note drawing eight or ten per cent interest when other lines of industry secure money for four or five per cent per annum, as there is in a business pay ing a reasonable compensation upon senting an investment of only fifty cents on the dollar. The only difference is, the water is in the interest rate in one instance and in the secur

ities in the other. The promoter ofttimes takes chances the development of the property involved but the usurer, as a rule, takes no chances and his success cripples the property involved. There may be industries that cry louder but none that suffer more severely from finan cial immorality in both law and cus

tom than that of agriculture. The farmers of America today are paying \$200,000,000 per annum in usury on real estate and chattel loans, and this interest capitalized at five per cent, represents \$4,000,000, 000 of fictitious values which the farm er is paying interest on. This sum of money is almost equal to the annual value of crops produced in the United

## THE CHEAPEST EATING-HOUSE IN TEXAS

Fully sixty per cent of the student body of this great educational institution is either in whole or in part self-supporting, thus emphasizing the dependence of the poor student upon state-supported institutions of higher education. Meals here average but twelve cents each, and many students get their board here on the University campus for \$8.00 per month, the average is about \$11.00 per month. Rooms in University Hall nearby are obtained at from \$1.50 to \$3.00 per month, although there are not sufficient rooms to supply the demand at these prices. Not a cent is made by the management of the cafateria-when it is discovered that a surplus is accumulating, the price of food is cut down. Here is actually board at cost. Besides furnishing cheap meals to over four hundred students per day, a half a dozen or more students are enabled to earn their board cleaning up tables, and otherwise serving the manage-
