### Pass War Bills President Demanded

Washington, July, 21. Congress joined with the administration today in speeding up the war work. In the space of a few hours, the machinery was started for drawing the first 687,000 men, means were approved by the senate for conserving food and other necessities vital to the maintenance of the army abroad and those at home, and the bill by which America hopes to gain the supremacy of the air was sent to the White House for the President's signature. Provost Marshal General Crowder, with the great lottery of yesterday officially completed, forwarded to the governors the President's nominations for the appellate exemption boards. Throughout the day a big force was at work checking up the lottery numbers to be forwarded late tonight or tomorrow to all the exemption boards. While this was going on the senate concluded its weeks of debate on the \$150,000,000 food bill, passing a sweeping measure giving to a board of three men complete control of food, feed and fuel distribution in this country. Less than an hour later the senate passed the \$640,000,000 airplane bill, previously passed by the house. In the meantime the bitter row between Chairman Denman and Manager Goethals of the shipping board was marked by an offer from General Goethals to resign. —San Angelo Standard.

### A & M Association Meet

The Observer this week received the following letter from Sweetwater which explains itself.

Sweetwater, July 21.

My dear Sir:—At a meeting of the West Texas A & M Association held at Sweetwater to-day which was represented by a majority of its Executive Committee, it was decided to call a meeting of all West Texas towns to be held at Sweetwater next Thursday, July 26th, at 10 A. M. for the purpose of taking definite steps by injunction to restrain the Board of Directors of the A. & M. College of Texas, from locating this school at Abilene, on the grounds that it was illegally located, in as much as Abilene did not receive a majority vote of said Locating Board. The Association has in its possession the affidavits of Lieut. Gov. Hobby and Hon. Fred W. Davis, and will have in its possession before next Thursday the affidavit of Speaker F. O. Fuller, each of whom state that they did not vote for Abilene on the first or second ballot. The Association to-day appointed a committee of leading attorneys to present to the Sweetwater meeting next Thursday a definite plan for legal proceedings which plan is to be discussed and adopted at that time. West Texas has no time to lose in this matter, as immediate action is necessary and for that reason the Association urges that you call a meeting of your representative citizens, and send a delegation to Sweetwater with full authorization for cooperation and financial support. The West Texas A & M Association is in this fight for fairness and justice, and intends to stay with it to a finish.

The Sweetwater meeting next Thursday is going to be a great West Texas meeting, and the presence of representatives from your City is not only urgent, but is absolutely necessary. Kindly advise me at once what steps you are taking, and how many representatives we may expect from your City.

June corn, milo maize, Spanish peanuts and soy beans will make a crop in about 100 days. Other crops mature about as follows: Sudan grass, 65 days; feterita, 75 days; New Era, or hay pea (bluespeckled) 65 days; black-eyed and whippoorwill peas, 75 days; butter beans, small variety, 75 days. These crops can be grown practically any where in Texas if they are sown by the first week in August. Only a little rain on them is needed. Some have been grown when up even later.

Squire Sam Story Manager of the Robert Lee Waterworks Company has ordered a new pump through the firm of W. K. Simpson which will arrive at an early date and then water will be coursing through the mains. This water proposition since the Waterworks has been out of commission has been a great annoyance and everybody will be glad when the waters of the Colorado are again put at our door.
