## ROAD ENGINEERS ON WEST TEXAS TOUR

Highway Experts of Federal and State Governments Inspecting Puget Sound to Gulf Road in West Texas.

Much interest has been aroused in the matter of constructing good roads in the Concho country by the presence of two expert highway engineers who arrived in San Angelo Tuesday afternoon. These experts are John D. Meriwether, representing the state highway commission, and Charles T. Harrison, representing the federal government. They are in San Angelo in connection with an official inspection of the Puget Sound to the Gulf highway and incidentally to confer with all persons interested in the construction of good roads. Before returning to Austin they will make a complete inspection of the Puget Sound to the Gulf highway and will be able to inform the highway commission of the general topographical conditions, nature of the soils, amount of road building material, etc.

Messrs Meriwether and Harrison will visit Coke county before leaving this section of the state. Coke county has decided to construct several miles of first class highway at once and the officials there wish to confer with the road experts. They want the engineers to go over the road to be constructed, a stretch of forty five miles, and discuss the nature of construction desired with the commissioners court and representative business men of the county. — San Angelo Standard.

## THE HIGHWAY WILL BE BUILT

All Preliminaries Have Been Completed—Work Will be Started at Early Date—Will Get State and Federal Aid.

The Del Rio Canadian Highway will be built through Coke county there is no doubt and work will be started as soon as machinery tools and men can be gotten together after the surveying is completed which will be begun at once. Commissioners Court met Saturday and had the following contract with the engineers and route designated put on the minutes.

It is ordered by the Commissioners in regular session Oct. 13th, 1917 that D. I. Durham County Judge of said county be and he is hereby authorized and directed to make the following agreement for said county to wit:

Robert Lee, Tex. Oct. 13, '17 To the Honorable Commissioners Court, of Coke county Texas.

Gentlemen: We hereby propose to do all the preliminary engineering work, making alignment maps, profiles, establish grade lines, prepare plans and specifications for the road improvement including bridges and culverts, and drainage ditches for carrying storm waters, together with an estimated cost of such improvements as Coke county may decide upon on State Highway No. 4, through said county as the same may be located and established by the State Highway department of Texas and the Commissioners Court of Coke county, Texas, such engineering to be done at our expense from the beginning of the work until its completion, and to include all salaries and expense of resident engineer who shall remain upon the ground at all times, chainmen, rodmen, instruments, car transportation, stakes, office and field supplies, and all office work and field work and engineering in connection therewith.

Said improvements and construction to be supervised by and all engineering work in connection therewith to be done by Hess & Skinner in such manner as shall meet the approval of the State Highway Department of Texas and in conformity with the rules, regulations, plans and specifications as shall be prescribed by said State Highway Department.

For the rendering of such services our fee will be five (5) per cent of the amount of money expended by the Commissioners Court on the improvement and construction of said Highway in Coke county, Texas, payable five (5) per cent each month on the amount of money paid out on such improvement and construction by the Commissioners Court of Coke county, Texas.

Coke county is under no obligations under this agreement to pay Hess & Skinner for serv-

ces of any nature until the plans and specifications for said Highway and the improvements to be made thereon have been approved by the State Highway engineer of Texas.

This contract not to become effective unless approved and ratified by the State Highway engineer of Texas.

Respectfully submitted, Hess & Skinner, Engineers. Accepted this 13th day of October 1917.

D. I. Durham, County Judge of Coke county.

By order of the Commissioners Court.

It is ordered by the court that that section of the State Highway No. 4, which passes through Coke county, Texas, be designated as follows, to-wit:

Beginning at the intersection of the Robert Lee and San Angelo road with the north line of Tom Green county, Texas, and the south line of Coke county, Texas.

Thence north with the present Robert Lee and San Angelo road about 17 miles to Robert Lee, the county seat of Coke county Texas.

Thence north east with the present Robert Lee and Ballinger road about 14 miles to Bronte, Coke county, Texas.

Thence north with the present

Bronte, and Sweetwater road through Fort Gay, Bronte about 15 miles to the intersection of the said road with the north line of Coke county and the south line of Nolan county near Blackwell, Texas.

This route having been approved and officially adopted by the Commissioners Court of Coke county, Texas, this 13th day of October 1917.

County Judge D. I. Durham and Commissioners I. A. Block, H. T. Wilkins, W. R. Brock and D. L. Fields, accompanied by Gray Reed and Jas. Cliff went to Paint Rock Wednesday to look over the road machinery used by Concho county and if it comes up to the requirements they contemplate purchasing like equipment to be used on the Coke county roads. Gray Reed transported them in his big seven passenger Overland.

The Court will issue contract Road and Bridge warrants to secure the funds and all portions of the road traversed by mail lines will receive Federal and State aid to the amount of fifty per cent of the cost of construction and it is very probable that they will get State aid on the balance of the road. They will anyway get Federal and State aid on over half the road built.

Members of the Court accompanied by Federal Engineer A. D. Merriweather came in Thursday and went over the entire line in Coke county.

This is a subject that interests every man. This war is costing a sum of money so great that no man can realize what such an amount means. You can pay in full at the time of application for any bond up to the value of \$1,000, if you wish.

If you care to pay for your bond in full at the time of application, you can have your bond by about October 10th. If you pay by installments you will receive your bond as soon as you have finished paying for it.

The bonds are free from Federal, State, or Local taxes. In case of wealthy people who pay income surtaxes, and hold bonds of over \$5,000, there is a small tax, but as far as the average man is concerned they are tax free.

### "LET THE OTHER FELLOW DO IT."

This is the thing that has caused so many failures, so much misery, so many deaths—"letting the other fellow do it." Time after time "the other fellow" does not do it. The Liberty Loan is a case in point. It is absolutely useless to rely upon the other fellow, because the amount to be raised is so enormous that it will take the combined self-denial and effort of every man, woman, and child in this country, to provide the money.

This leads naturally to another thought. It is not enough that we merely subscribe. We must see that our neighbor subscribes, because if he falls down, we ourselves shall suffer, even although we may have done our share.

There are just a few people left in this country who say "let the rich man find the money." When the government has had its needs supplied, the rich man will not be so rich; his taxes will be enormous, and many a wealthy company struggling with the high cost of everything they use in their business, in addition to their taxation, will have a difficulty in securing profits for their shareholders. The profits of those making war supplies will be cut in half, at least, by government action. Again we must remember that our wealthy men invested millions and millions of dollars in the loan last time and will do it again. The average citizen must realize that the wealthy man is doing his share, and that it is to the farmer, the merchant and the working man that the country look for a large share of the subscriptions to the present loan.

"If you say 'let the other fellow do it,' the loan will fail, we shall be disgraced in the eyes of the world, the resistance to Germany of our allies may break down, and the most terrible thing in the world will happen to us—conquest by Germany. This would mean taxation beyond human endurance, national disgrace and having to work for German masters for years to come.

The Germans are not willing "to let the other fellow do it." Their boys of 14 and their old men of 60 are serving in the army, their women and their children are going short of food; they are giving up almost every cent they possess in order to beat this country. Surely we have more patriotism than the Germans, more sense—if not, then we deserve to be beaten.

The Demonstration Work.

The United States Department of Agriculture co-operating with Agricultural Institutions of each state are every year putting men into the field, who are educated along the lines of agriculture, to assist the farmers in any way they can. The following are some of the things the work stands for:

1. To assist rural organizations of Farmers Clubs and community co operation.
2. Promote improved methods in crop production.
3. Introduces more and better live stock.
4. Assist Agricultural Clubs for improvement in production of corn, pigs, poultry, etc.
5. Assist in marketing and distribution.
6. Aids in control of Hog cholera and other animal diseases.
7. Helps in the construction of dipping vats for cattle and other live stock and in charging and testing dip for farmers and live stock men.
8. Aids in installing drainage system, terracing hillside

lands and leveling.

9. Conducts farmers short course schools, farmers meetings, agricultural demonstrations, etc.

10. Forms Breeders and other live stock organizations.

11. Plans system of crop rotation for the improvement of land.

12. The planning of feeding live stock balanced ration, etc., on the farm by the farmer.

13. Organizes the rural boys into Agricultural Clubs, such as corn, cotton, milo, feterita, kaffir, Pig and Baby Beef Clubs, and gives them instruction and advice about working their crops, and teaches the boys how to feed their pigs and calves a balanced ration, thereby getting a much larger and more profitable gain.
